
### SBAC ELA Participation Rates Comparison for SY22-23 – SY23-24 by Race/Ethnicity





### SBAC ELA Participation Rates Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Student Groups






### SBAC MATH Participation Rates Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Race/Ethnicity






### SBAC MATH Participation Rates Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Student Groups




### SBAC ELA Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Race/Ethnicity






### SBAC ELA Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Student Groups






### SBAC ELA Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Grades




### SBAC MATH Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Race/Ethnicity






### SBAC MATH Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Student Groups



#### **Grade 5 Science Proficiency Rates**




### Grade 5 Science Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Race/Ethnicity






### **Grade 5 Science Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Student Groups**




### Grade 8 Science Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Race/Ethnicity






### Grade 8 Science Proficiency Rate Comparison for SY22-23 - SY23-24 by Student Groups






#### High School (Grade9/10) Science Proficiency Rates





#### **How are Star Ratings Calculated?**



- Under the NSPF, each public school is issued an annual index score based on school performance measures;
- A school's star rating is associated with their Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) index score—the total points received by a school based on their performance across various performance measures;
- Each star rating corresponds to a score range which is based on a school's total index score.

#### **Star Rating System**



The star rating is the summative annual determination made for all Nevada public schools. A school's star rating is associated with their *NSPF INDEX SCORE*, which is the total points received by a school based on their performance across various *Indicators and Measures* over the prior school year.
























