

The Use of GRAD Score to Identify At-Risk Weighted Funding

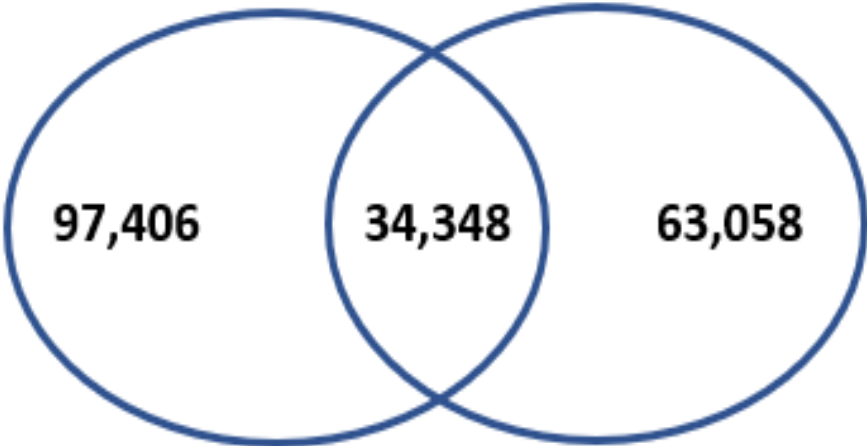


At-Risk Definition

- NRS 387.1211: At-risk pupil means a pupil who is within the quintile of pupils determined to be most in need of additional services and assistance to graduate based on one or more measures prescribed by the State Board, which may include, without limitation, consideration of whether a pupil:
 - (a) Is economically disadvantaged;
 - (b) Is at risk of dropping out of high school; or
 - (c) Fails to meet minimum standards of academic proficiency.

At-Risk Venn Diagram

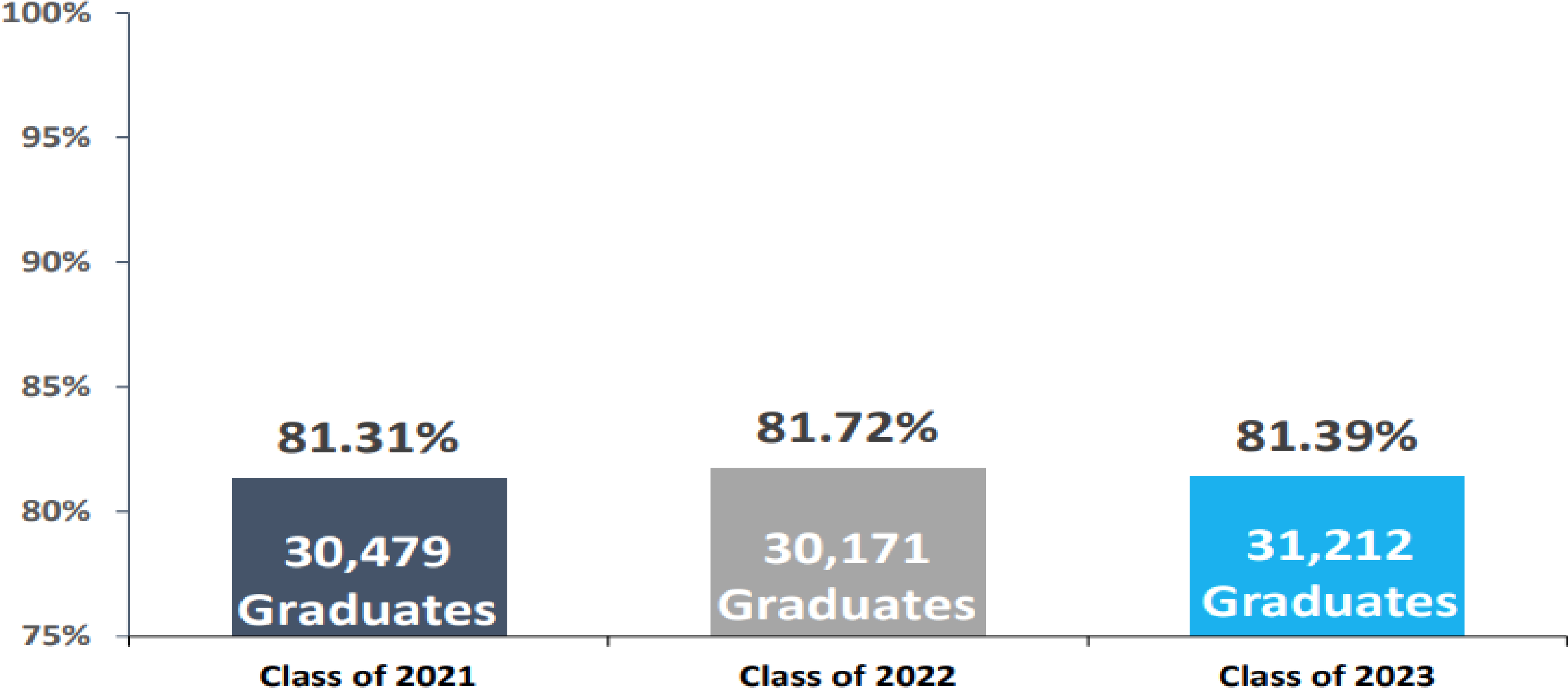

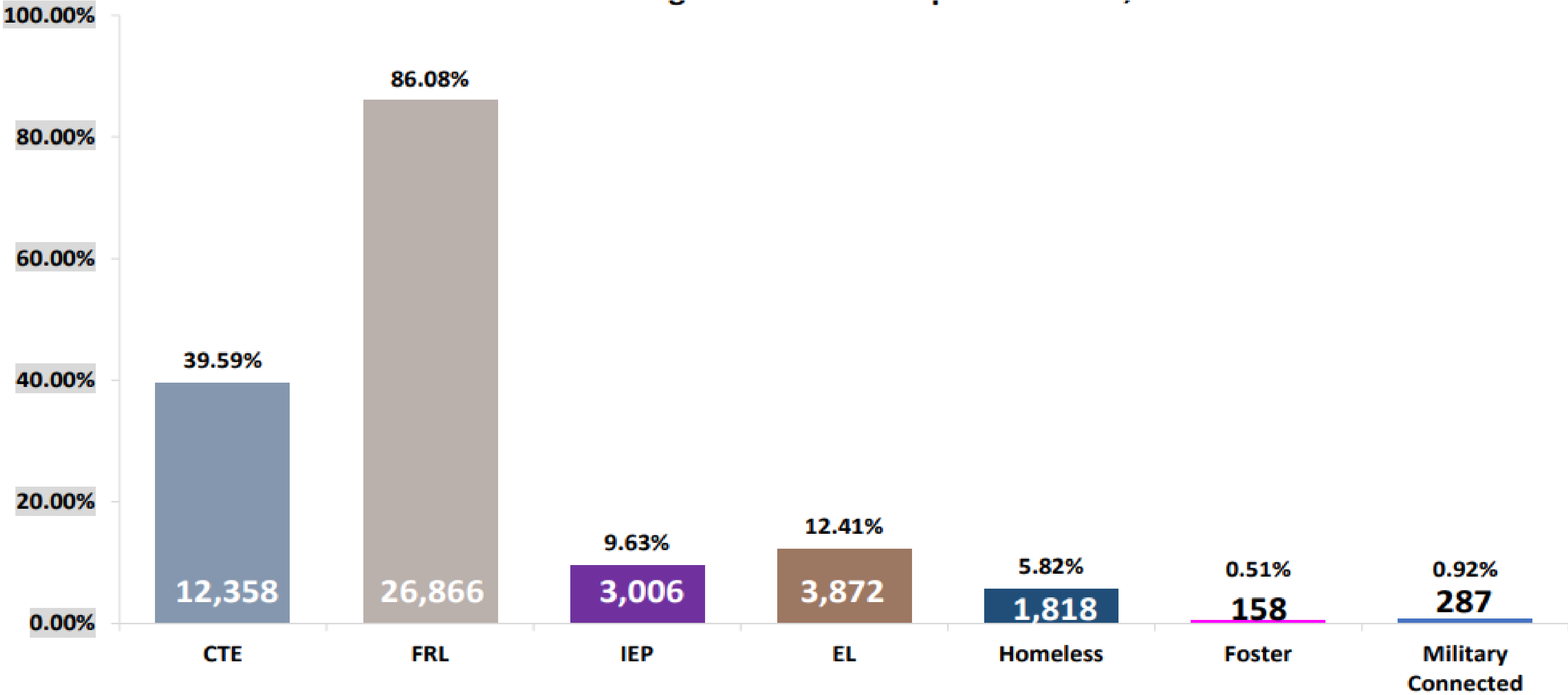

Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS)

Tier 3 – Tertiary Interventions

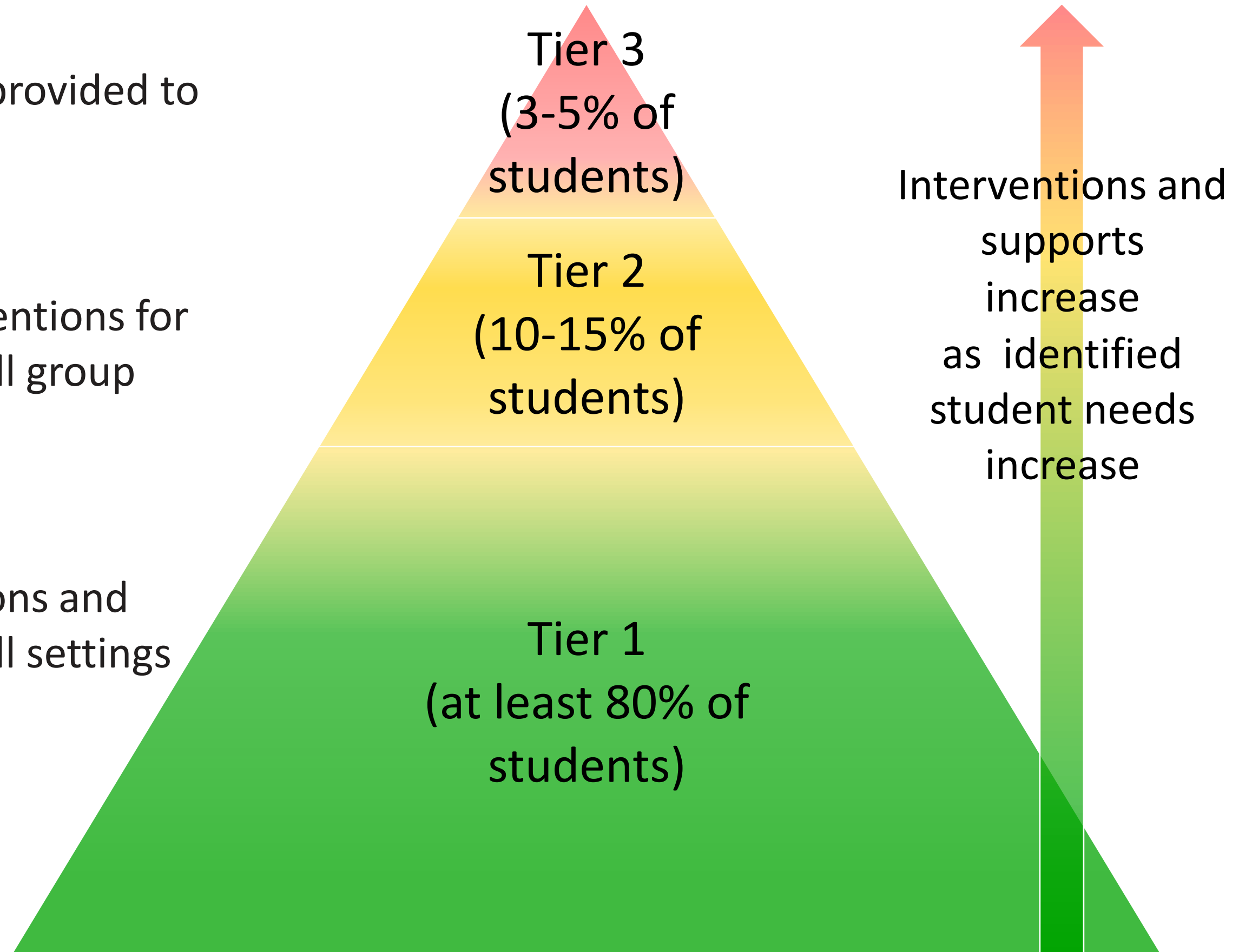
- Intensive interventions and supports provided to individual students

Tier 2 – Secondary Interventions

- Rapid response, high efficiency interventions for some students, often provided in small group settings

Tier 1 – Universal Interventions

- Preventative and proactive interventions and supports provided to all students, in all settings



MTSS & At-Risk Funding

Tier 3 – Tertiary Interventions

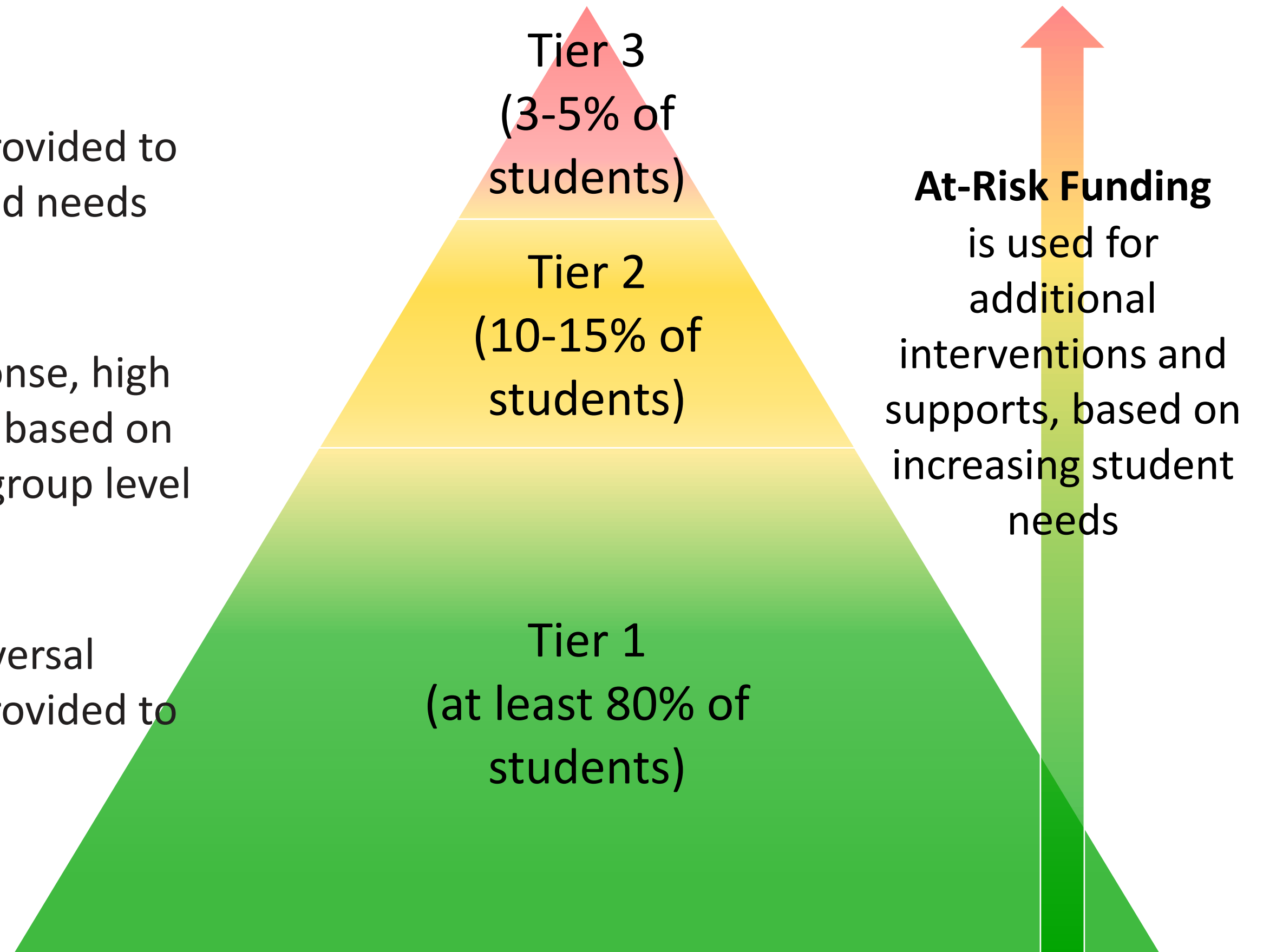
- At-Risk Funding is used for intensive interventions and supports that are provided to individual students, based on identified needs

Tier 2 – Secondary Interventions

- At-Risk Funding is used for rapid response, high efficiency interventions and supports, based on identified student needs at the small group level

Tier 1 – Universal Interventions

- Adjusted Base Funding is used for universal interventions and supports that are provided to all students, in all settings
