



All Districts Graduation Rate Trends





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Three Largest Districts Graduation Rate Trends




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
Graduating Class of 2023 Demographics by Race/Ethnicity




Graduating Class of 2023 Demographics by Student Group


Statewide Special Populations Graduation Rate Trends








Graduation Rates by Race/Ethnicity Graduating Class of 2023




Graduating Class of 2023 Demographics by Gender

3-Year Graduation Rate Trends by Gender






Diploma Types by Graduating Class



Diploma Type by Race/Ethnicity for the Class of 2023









CCR Diploma Percentage by Gender








CCR Diploma Percentage by Student Groups









CCR Diploma Percentages for the Graduating Classes of 2021, 2022, and 2023







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All Districts 2023 CCR Diploma Percentages




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All Districts CCR Percentage Trends








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
Graduating Class of 2023 CCR Diploma Demographics by Race/Ethnicity


Statewide CCR Diploma Percentage Trends by Race/Ethnicity






Graduating Class of 2023 CCR Demographics by Student Group



Statewide CCR Diploma Percentage Trends by Special Populations








Graduating Class of 2023 CCR Demographics by Gender



Nevada High School Graduation Requirements

To receive a high school diploma in Nevada, students must complete their required course work, earn the credits required by State law and by their district, and participate in assessments required by both State and federal law. The following informational <u>document</u> explains the high school assessments and graduation requirements under Nevada law. Districts may have requirements that extend beyond State requirements.

Course of Study and Required Credits

Units of credit generally comprise one year of coursework and require at least 120 hours of instruction. Credit-earning courses are required by State law to be taught by all public high schools as a course of study, including but not limited to, for a standard diploma:

- Four units of English Language Arts
- Three units of Mathematics including at least Algebra I and Geometry
- Two units of Science including at least two laboratory courses
- Three units of Social Studies including
- o One-half unit of American Government
- One-half unit of Economics and Financial Literacy
- o One unit of American History
- One unit of World History or Geography

Additional courses must be made available to fulfill graduation credit requirements for all diploma types including but not limited to:

- The Arts
- Computer Science Education and Technology
- Health
- Physical Education

Permissible elective courses of study may include additional courses in the subjects listed above and may include but not limited to:

- Career and Technical Education (CTE)
- Employability Skills
- Great Basin Native Languages
- World Languages

Required Assessments

The State of Nevada and State Board of Education, in alignment with federal education law, have determined participation in the following assessments to be required for graduation:

- Class of 2023 and 2024 ACT Plus Writing for college and career readiness
- Class of 2025 and 2026 To be determined
- Civics Assessment

Types of Diplomas and Seals

There are two general-education and two inclusive-adaptive diplomas available by law to Nevada students graduating from public high schools. For specific credit requirements by diploma type, see the reverse side of this document.

- The Advanced Diploma requires credit units, GPA, and participation on the ACT.
- The Standard Diploma requires credit units and participation on the ACT.
- The Alternative Diploma requires credit units and participation on the NAA.
- The Adjusted Diploma is adapted to student needs according to an IEP.
- The College and Career Ready (CCR) Diploma requires credit units and GPA requirements of the Advanced Diploma plus additional advanced coursework and associated endorsement completion requirements.
- State Seals of Biliteracy, Civics, Financial Literacy, STEM, and STEAM require demonstrations of proficiency by GPA and/or assessment.

Career-Ready Endorsement:

- Pass one of the two State Board of Education's approved career-readiness assessments (ACT NCRC ≥Silver; or ASVAB ≥50); OR
- Earn the CTE Skill Attainment Certificate (NAC 389.800); OR
- Obtain and industry-recognized credential (approved and on GOWINN's Nevada Industry-Recognized Credential List).

Reporting of Graduation Rates

How are graduation rates calculated?

- Under ESSA (section 1111(h)(1)(C)(iii)(II)), SEA and LEA (local education agencies or school districts and charter schools) must calculate and report on its annual report card a four year adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR), disaggregated by subgroups.
- The four-year ACGR is the number of students who graduate from high school in four years with a regular high school diploma, plus all students with the most significant cognitive disabilities who are assessed using an alternate assessment aligned with alternate academic achievement standards and who graduate with a Statedefined alternate diploma, divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class.

What is the difference between a cohort and a graduating class?

- Cohort is the student population based on the number of students who enter grade 9 for the first time
 adjusted by adding into any student who transfers in later during grade 9 or during the next three years and
 subtracting any student who transfers out, emigrates to another country, or dies during that same period.
- Graduating class means a group of pupils who, as of the date on which they begin high school, are scheduled to graduate from high school at the end of a specified school year.

Where does the data come from?

- Data is provided by the LEAs.
- What is the NDE timeline for data collection and reporting?
 - 09/27/2023 Data validation started.
 - 10/30/2023 Data validation ended.
 - 01/2024 Graduation rates are released to public.



Nevada Diploma Types

- College and Career Ready (CCR) Diploma (AB 7, 2017): a diploma which includes collegeready endorsement that reflects students who have completed certain coursework or
 obtained experience that makes them qualified for and prepared to succeed in college
 without the need for remediation; and, a career-ready endorsement that reflects students
 who have completed certain coursework or obtained certain experience that makes them
 qualified for and prepared to succeed in post-secondary education or job training in highdemand occupations.
- Advanced Diploma (NAC 390.430): a diploma awarded to students who complete requirements above and beyond what is required for a regular diploma.
- Standard Diploma (NAC 390.061): a diploma which evidences a pupil's graduation from high school but which is not an adjusted diploma or an adult standard diploma.
- Alternative Diploma (AB 64, 2017): a diploma awarded to students with significant cognitive disabilities who pass an alternate assessment prescribed by the State Board of Education.
- Adult Diploma (NAC 389.017): a diploma which evidences the graduation from high school of a person who has met the requirements for graduation through:
 - 1. An adult high school program established by a school district; or
 - 2. An alternative program for the education of pupils at risk of dropping out of school established by a school district pursuant to NRS 388.537.



Nevada Non-Diploma Credentials

- Adjusted Diploma (NAC 389.015): a diploma which evidences the graduation from high school of a pupil with a disability after the pupil has met special requirements or adjusted standards
- **High School Equivalency Certificate:** a certificate which is given to adults who pass the high school equivalency tests. The certificate is widely recognized as the equivalent of a high school diploma but is not counted as a graduate in the ACGR.

Nevada Adult Diploma Exclusion from ACGR

According to review by the United States Department of Education in 2021, NDE was asked to exclude Adult Diplomas as graduates in the ACGR process since Adult Diplomas are not being awarded to the preponderance of students (less than 1%) in the State. According to this business rule change per USDOE review, Adult Diplomas cannot be included in the ACGR calculation as graduates. Adult Diplomas will continue to be counted as a Nevada diploma which evidences the graduation from high school of a person who has met the requirements of graduation as defined in NAC 390.018.








Carson City Graduation Rate Trends






Churchill Graduation Rate Trends






Clark Graduation Rate Trends






Douglas Graduation Rate Trends











Eureka Graduation Rate Trends






Humboldt Graduation Rate Trends






Lander Graduation Rate Trends






Lincoln Graduation Rate Trends






Lyon Graduation Rate Trends






Mineral Graduation Rate Trends






Nye Graduation Rate Trends








