## Statewide Improvement Plan (STIP)

- Goal 4. All students graduate future-ready and globally prepared for postsecondary success and civic life.
- Equity Strategy: Increase participation in college-level and CTE coursework - NDE will collaborate with public schools and districts to increase the percentage of historically underserved students participating in and successfully completing dual credit, concurrent enrollment, Advanced Placement (AP) and International Baccalaureate (IB) courses, and Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs of study by at least 5\% year over year.
- Success Strategy: Reduce graduation rate opportunity gaps - NDE will collaborate with public schools and districts to close opportunity gaps in graduation rates as reflected by an increase in graduation rates.
- Inclusivity Strategy: Enhance support for English Learners (ELs) - NDE will collaborate with public schools and districts to ensure that all English Learners (ELs) have the practices, knowledge, and skills to demonstrate proficiency through assessments and graduation rates on par with or better than that of their non-EL peers by 2025

## Support for the Class of 2020 in Response to COVID-19

- On April 2, 2020, the Nevada Department of Education (NDE) published "Class of 2020 Graduation Guidance". This document, developed in consultation with school district and charter school leaders, provided support to school districts and charter schools in the following areas:
- Attendance Requirements
- Course Completion Requires
- GPA Requirements for Class Rank and Other Factors
- Assessment Requirements
- On April 15, 2020, NDE published Guidance Memorandum \#20-01 which waived participation in a civics assessment as a condition of graduation for the Class of 2020


## Highlights of Nevada's Graduating Class of 2020

- The Class of 2020 graduation rate of $82.57 \%$ decreased by 1.54 percentage points from the previous year's rate of $84.11 \%$, but the State's overall rate has remained above $\mathbf{8 0 \%}$ for the past four consecutive years
- There are 13 school districts with graduation rates that exceed the state average of $82.57 \%$
- There are 10 school districts with graduation rates that increased over the previous year, White Pine had the highest gain moving from 66.9\% to 82.9\%
- Five districts had graduation rates higher than 90\%: Pershing (94.87\%), Lincoln (94.03\%), Humboldt (91.29\%), Mineral (91.67\%), and Eureka (90.91\%)
- Career and Technical Education students maintain one of the highest graduation rates of all student groups at 93.22\%

## Diploma Types

## Nevada Diploma Types

- Adult Diploma (NAC 389.017): a diploma which evidences the graduation from high school of a person who has met the requirements for graduation through:

1. An adult high school program established by a school district; or
2. An alternative program for the education of pupils at risk of dropping out of school established by a school district pursuant to NRS 388.537.

- Advanced Diploma (NAC 390.430): a diploma awarded to students who complete requirements above and beyond what is required for a regular diploma.
- Standard Diploma (NAC 390.061): a diploma which evidences a pupil's graduation from high school but which is not an adjusted diploma or an adult standard diploma.
- Alternative Diploma (AB 64): a diploma awarded to students with significant cognitive disabilities who pass an alternate assessment prescribed by the State Board of Education.
- College and Career Ready (CCR) Diploma (AB 7): a diploma which includes college-ready endorsement that reflects students who have completed certain coursework or obtained experience that makes them qualified for and prepared to succeed in college without the need for remediation; and, a career-ready endorsement that reflects students who have completed certain coursework or obtained certain experience that makes them qualified for and prepared to succeed in post-secondary education or job training in high-demand occupations.

## Appendix

## Reporting of Graduation Rates

- How are graduation rates calculated?
- Under ESSA (section 1111(h)(1)(C)(iii)(II)), SEA and LEA must calculate and report on its annual report card a four year adjusted cohort graduation rate (ACGR), disaggregated by subgroups.
- The four-year ACGR is the number of students who graduate from high school in four years with a regular high school diploma, plus all students with the most significant cognitive disabilities who are assessed using an alternate assessment aligned with alternate academic achievement standards and who graduate with a Statedefined alternate diploma, divided by the number of students who form the adjusted cohort for the graduating class.
- What is the difference between a cohort and a graduating class?
- Cohort is the student population based on the number of students who enter grade 9 for the first time adjusted by adding into any student who transfers in later during grade 9 or during the next three years and subtracting any student who transfers out, emigrates to another country, or dies during that same period.
- Graduating class means a group of pupils who, as of the date on which they begin high school, are scheduled to graduate from high school at the end of a specified school year.
- Where does the data come from?
- Data is provided by the LEAs.
- What is the NDE timeline for data collection and reporting?
- 10/08/2020 Data validation started.
- 10/29/2020 Data validation ended.
- 11/12/2020 Graduation rates are released to public.


## Nevada Non-Diploma Credentials

- Adjusted Diploma (NAC 389.015): a diploma which evidences the graduation from high school of a pupil with a disability after the pupil has met special requirements or adjusted standards
- High School Equivalency Certificate: a certificate which is given to adults who pass the high school equivalency tests. The certificate is widely recognized as the equivalent of a high school diploma, but is not counted as a graduate in the ACGR.
