CREDIT TOWARD GRADUATION FROM HIGH SCHOOL  
FOR COURSES TAKEN THROUGH THE NEVADA SYSTEM OF HIGHER EDUCATION

**Strategic Imperative(s):** Academic Excellence (SI-1)

**Focus Area(s):** Academic Growth (FA-2); College and Career Readiness (FA-4)

Nevada Revised Statutes 389.160 requires approval of courses for which high school credit is granted from both the Board of School Trustees of each county school district and the State Board of Education. Courses to be considered for high school dual enrollment credit are noted below. These courses are in addition to courses previously approved by the Board of School Trustees.

These courses could be offered for dual credit by any Nevada System of Higher Education institution and will be available for students participating in dual enrollment programs. Dual enrollment program costs are funded by the College and Career Readiness Dual Enrollment Grant and participating students.

Should the Board of School Trustees not approve these courses for high school dual credit, students concurrently enrolled in these classes will not earn high school credit.
