## Nevada Department of Education Regulatory Process<sup>1</sup>

Identify and Engage

- The State Board of Education, Department of Education, and Commission on Professional Standards may identify regulations that need to be written, revised, or repealed.
- •During this time, the Department engages with internal and external stakeholders. This may involve the development of a workgroup, if necessary.
- •Draft language will begin to be developed.

Workshop for Public Comment

- A workshop is scheduled with 15-day notice.
- During a workshop, the State Board of Education, Department of Education, and Commission on Professional Standards are soliciting comments from any interested people, groups, or organizations.

Regulation Language

- After the workshop is complete, final language will be drafted and sent to the Legislative Counsel Bureau (LCB).
- LCB drafts the final regulatory language and returns to State Board of Education, Department of Education, or Commission on Professional Standards in approximately 30 days.

Public Hearing

- A public hearing is scheduled with 30-day notice for adoption of the final regulatory language.
- Members of the public are invited to attend and provide written and/or oral submissions regarding the proposed regulation.

Codification

- After the regulation is adopted by the Department of Education or the State Board of Education, it is submitted to the Legislative Commission.
- The Legislative Commission schedules regulations for review and final approval.
- If the regulation is approved the Legislative Commission, it is filed by the Secretary of State and becomes effective.
