B. Eligible Applicants

This request for new funding application is open to all Nevada school districts and charter schools and/or Nevada State Public Charter School Authority on behalf of those schools that wish to apply for funding.

C. Goals

D. Funding Information

Available Funds

The Trauma Informed & Restorative Practices ESSER II funding is \$63,600.00. The Trauma Informed & Restorative Practices ESSER III funding is \$2,696,240.00.

Duration of Subgrants

Awards from the Trauma Informed & Restorative Practices ESSER II funding will be begin when sub-grant is executed – June 30, 2022. Unexpended funds at the end of FY 22 may revert to the state and will only carry forward for subgrantees with a memo granting carry forward.

Awards from the Trauma Informed & Restorative Practices ESSER III funding will be beginning when sub-grant is executed – June 30, 2024. Unexpended funds at the end of FY 24 will revert to the state and will not carry forward for subgrantees.

Use of Funds and Unauthorized Activities/Expenses
