Community: NDE collaborates with educators, districts, families, stakeholders, and partner agencies to lead a high-performing and responsive system of education for all Nevadans



 - <u>shift the focus</u> of the Strategies in the Statewide Plan for the Improvement of Pupils to ensure alignment with the work of NDE divisions and offices moving forward, as well as identify more authentic measures of student progress beyond academic assessment results
 - submit the 2023 STIP Addendum pursuant to NRS 385.111





Success: Reduce graduation rate opportunity gaps






Goal5: Access to educational opportunities

Schools receiving designation based on results from NV School Climate and Social Emotional Learning Survey


