

Strategic Improvement Plan Alignment

Goal 2: All students have access to effective educators.

Input: Support and develop professional learning events and resources

Output: implement and develop professional learning and resources for educational partners and stakeholders

Outcome: Increase of 10% from baseline of families reporting they are welcomed as equal partners and students reporting that they feel their educator is able to meet their needs.

Goal 3: All students experience continued academic growth.

Input: Develop capacity within, advocate for, and create systems of support for licensed educational personnel to serve all learners

Output: Strategic allocation of financial and human capital resources to support historically underserved student populations

Outcome: Increase the percent of educators reporting on the educator climate survey that they have the necessary resources and supports to meet the needs of historically underserved student populations.




The Interstate Compact on Educational Opportunity for Military Children

- Active-duty members of the armed forces
- National Guard and Reserve on Title 10 orders
- Uniformed Members of National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) & U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS)
- Members or veterans who are medically discharged or retired for one year
- Members of uniformed services who die while on active duty, for a period of one year after death

The Nevada Purple Star School Application Process

- Two application periods per year
 - November to April
 - April to November
- Application available on the Nevada Department of Education Purple Star School webpage
- Committee of military-connected personnel individually review applications
- Rubric aligned with Purple Star Schools
 Program requirements



Purple Star School Required Activities

- Schools must have an assigned staff Point of Contact (POC) for military-connected students and families.
- The POC provides ongoing professional development for staff on addressing and assessing the needs of military students.
- Schools must maintain a designated Purple Star School page on their website.
- Schools must celebrate the Month of the Military Child (April).
- Schools must create and maintain an active student-led transition program.

Purple Star School Optional Activities

- All or additional staff members completed the "Military Children in Our Schools" professional development course
- The school board passed a resolution publicizing the school's support for military students and families
- The school holds fundraisers to support military veterans and active-duty members
- The school has a U.S. Army Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps (JROTC) program in place
- The school hosts a military appreciation night at a sporting event
- The school has a public military display, hosted an annual militaryfriendly program, or marches in a parade
- The staff has attended/viewed webinars focused on Purple Star Schools or military-connected families
