## Universal Screening

- Use of <u>brief</u> tools across a <u>population</u> to identify those possessing some <u>condition</u>
- Important role within MTSS
  - Identify students unresponsive to Tier 1
  - Move to Tiers 2 or 3

### Universal Screening: Procedures

#### • Who?

• Evaluate ALL students using a screening measure

#### • When?

- 1-3 times per year (Fall, Winter, and Spring)
- 4-6 weeks into school year

#### • How?

- Many different administrative procedures (depending on the informant)
- All meant to be very brief

Student	N/A	Secondary	*Primary

### Universal Screening: Methods

- Behavioral and Emotional Screening System (BESS; Kamphaus & Reynolds, 2007)
- Student Risk Screening Scale (SRSS; Drummond, 1994)
- Social, Academic, & Emotional Behavior Risk
  Screener (SAEBRS; Kilgus & von der Embse, 2014)

## Barriers to Implementation

- Time and effort
  - Particularly for teacher measures
- Number of identified students
- Need to connect to intervention
- Consent and assent
- Alternative?
  - <u>Target screening</u> → Confirm risk and inform intervention
