

## NV Department of Education Moral Turpitude Matrix

**The following offenses shall be considered to be offenses involving moral turpitude for purposes of [NRS 391.033](#), and will result in:**

<b>Lifetime disqualification upon conviction:</b>	<b>Disqualification for 10 years from the date of conviction:</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Aiding a person in the commission of a felony or gross misdemeanor</li> <li>• Animal cruelty</li> <li>• Arson</li> <li>• Assault with a deadly weapon</li> <li>• Battery, including domestic violence – misdemeanor (second or subsequent offense)</li> <li>• Battery with a deadly weapon</li> <li>• Bribery</li> <li>• Burglary</li> <li>• Coercion</li> <li>• Child abuse, neglect, or endangerment</li> <li>• Elder abuse, neglect, or endangerment</li> <li>• Extortion</li> <li>• False imprisonment</li> <li>• Human trafficking</li> <li>• Identity theft</li> <li>• Involuntary servitude</li> <li>• Kidnapping</li> <li>• Manslaughter</li> <li>• Manufacturing, distributing, or cultivating a controlled substance</li> <li>• Mayhem</li> <li>• Murder</li> <li>• Offenses committed under color of authority</li> <li>• Receipt of stolen property</li> <li>• Rescuing a prisoner from lawful custody</li> <li>• Robbery</li> <li>• Sexual offenses</li> <li>• Terrorism</li> <li>• Unlawful possession or use of a firearm, explosive, or other weapon</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Contributing to the delinquency of a minor</li> <li>• DUI/DWI – alcohol or prohibited substance (second or subsequent offense, or felony DUI)</li> <li>• Embezzlement</li> <li>• Forgery/counterfeiting</li> <li>• Fraud</li> <li>• Grand Larceny</li> <li>• Petit larceny/shoplifting (second or subsequent offense)</li> <li>• Possession of a controlled substance (no intent to sell/distribute); excludes possession of marijuana in an amount deemed to be for personal use</li> <li>• Theft (other than petit larceny or shoplifting)</li> </ul>

**Note that:**

- A conviction for attempt, conspiracy, or solicitation to commit any offense listed above shall be considered an offense involving moral turpitude.
- A first conviction for misdemeanor battery (including domestic violence), misdemeanor DUI/DWI, or misdemeanor theft in any form (e.g. petit larceny, shoplifting, etc.) shall not be considered an offense involving moral turpitude.
- A conviction for possession of marijuana in any form for personal use shall not be considered an offense involving moral turpitude.
- A conviction for a felony not listed above shall not be considered an offense involving moral turpitude; however, such a conviction may still be grounds for denial or suspension/revocation of a license pursuant to [NRS 391.033\(5\)\(b\)](#) and [NRS 391.330\(4\)](#).
