I, Dena Durish, Deputy Superintendent of Educator Effectiveness and Family Engagement, do hereby certify that, to the best of my knowledge or belief:

- 1. The proposed permanent regulation additions to NAC 391 are <u>not</u> likely to (a) impose a direct or significant economic burden upon a small business, or (b) directly restrict the formation, operation or expansion of a small business. The proposed regulations deal only with the process for providing additional business rule on the Nevada Educator Performance Framework (NEPF) Protocols and the development and implementation of Student Learning Goals (SLG) pursuant to NRS 391.460.
