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Alignment to State Improvement Plan (STIP)

What Comprises the Nevada Accountability Portal?

□ Nevada Report Card

The Nevada Report Card includes annual reports of Accountability that provide State, district and school related Accountability data for various school years. Information found with the Nevada Report Card includes student achievement data, school rating information, high school graduation rates, student-teacher ratios, educator qualifications, school discipline data, student enrollment numbers and much more.

□ Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF)

The NSPF is an annual summary of school performance data. The NSPF meets State and Federal policy requirements and provides each school level with a unique rating system. School performance ratings can be found through the Nevada Report Card website.

□ Nevada Growth Model

The Nevada Growth Model compares schools within the state and within a specified Nevada district using the Median Growth Percentile (MGP), percentage of students that are proficient, and percent of students meeting their Adequate Growth Percentiles (AGPs) on the state's mathematics, English Language Arts (ELA), and English Language Proficiency assessments. MGPs are determined by identifying the median Student Growth Percentiles (SGPs) for the students at a school. The MGP for each school is the measure used for school accountability.



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The Nevada Accountability Portal

- Accountability and Assessment requirements were waived by the United States Department of Education (USDOE) for the 2019-2020 school year in response to COVID-19
- As a result, the 2019-2020 Nevada Accountability Portal will include:
 - Star ratings carried over from the 2018-2019 school year
 - School designations carried over from the 2018-2019 school year



The Nevada Accountability Portal

What's New to the Nevada Accountability Portal?

- **❖Per Pupil Expenditures** of federal, state, and local funds, including actual personnel expenditures and actual non-personnel expenditures of federal, State and local funds disaggregated by source of funds, for each local education agency (LEA) and each school in the State for the preceding fiscal year (ESSA Requirement)
- **❖Professional Qualifications of Educators** including the number and percentage of inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders, teachers teaching with emergency or provisional credentials, teachers who are not teaching in the subject of field for which the teacher is certified or licensed (NRS 385A.230)
- *Disaggregated Discipline Data per the 80th Session of the Nevada Legislature (2019)

School Comparison Tool


- The school comparison tool provides users with the ability to search for schools in Nevada based upon criteria such as school level, school type, star rating, enrollment, performance results, graduation rates, and more
- ➤ This tool gives the user the ability to compare schools' key accountability data



School Level Per Pupil Expenditure Report

- Provides relevant school information including star rating and student population size
- Compares per pupil spending by school, district, and state
- ❖Breaks down school spending by instruction, instructional support, operations, and leadership expenditures





Dollars Spent Per Pupil

This school is funded through a combination of Federal and State/Local funds. The amounts in the bar graphs below are the dollars spent per student, broken down by source of funds. The amount of money spent per student depends on many factors, including student enrollment, staffing, special programs, and whether the school receives State or Federal grant funds.



How Does My School Spend Its Funds?

This school spends money on four types of Personnel and Non-Personnel costs: Instruction, Instructional Support, Operations, and Leadership.



Instruction Personnel: Includes salaries and benefits of staff providing direct instruction to students (teachers, teacher aids, substitutes, instructional paraprofessional in the classroom).

Instructional Support Non-personnel: All other costs associated with preparing pupils to learn, preparing teachers to be effective educators, and administering programs to reap student improvements.

Leadership Personnel: School and district leaders and policy makers (principals, assistant principals, school office, superintendent). Instruction Non-personnel: Includes instructional materials and supplies as well as pupil-use technology and software.


Operations Personnel: Central services (accounting, finance, human resources), facilities, transportation and food services personnel, and safety/security.

Leadership Non-personnel: School and district administrative office supplies, copier leases and maintenance agreements, postage, legal services Instructional Support Non-personnel: All other costs associated with preparing pupils to learn, preparing teachers to be effective educators, and administering programs to reap student improvements.

Operations Non-personnel: Maintenance and operating costs of buses, facilities, food service programs, safety and security (building upkeep, utilities and maintenance, fuels, supplies, service contracts).

School Comparison Tool

- ❖Compare up to three schools on multiple factors such as school level, school type, and star rating
- ❖Provides demographic data such as, race/ethnicity, English learners, students with disabilities, and economically disadvantaged students
- Also compares per pupil spending, English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics proficiency, chronic absenteeism rates, and bullying incidents

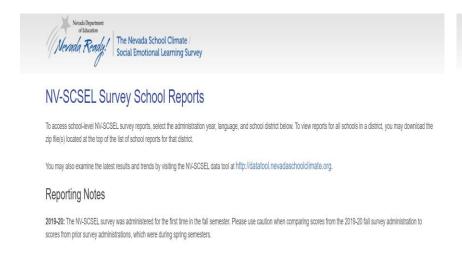


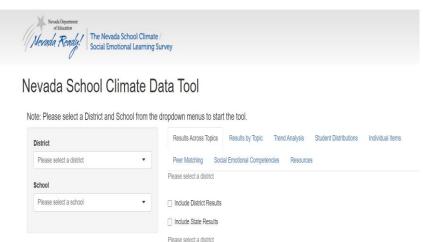
