

## Exception Pupils Ages 3-21 Speech and Language Impairments NAC 391.370

- 1. Complete the general requirements for all educator licenses: General License Requirements
- 2. Bachelor's or more advanced degree from an accredited college/university; and
- 3. Certificate of clinical competence in speech from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA) or an equivalent license from the Speech-Language Pathology, Audiology and Hearing Aid Dispensing Board; or
- 4. Eight (8) credits of student teaching involving pupils who have speech and language impairments, a clinical practicum with those pupils, equivalent field experience with those pupils or one (1) year of verifiable teaching experience with those pupils; and
- 5. Twenty-eight (28) credits to include coursework in the following areas:
  - A. Audiology
  - B. Methods for the assessment and treatment of the disorders of articulation, fluency, voice and language
  - C. The development of normal speech and language
  - D. Science of speech and voice
  - E. Phonetics
  - F. Introduction to special education or the education of pupils who have disabilities; and
  - G. Parental involvement in programs for pupils who have disabilities

Endorsement Exception: All holders of a current ASHA card will not be required to complete the subject area exam. The current card must be submitted with your application in order to have this exam waived.
