1. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Meeting called to order at 3:01 p.m. by Chair Jason Trevino. Quorum was established and Chair Trevino led attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. LEGISLATIVE UPDATES

Member Megan Hall gave committee members an overview of the on the legislative counsel digest from the Division of Emergency Management. A bill draft review was submitted to update schools required plan submission due date of July 1st. This will require schools to submit their plans to the school board of trustees by August 1st with a deadline to submit plans to the Division of Emergency Management by August 15th. The recommendation has been accepted, and will be presented to legislature on date that is to be determined.

7. EMERGENCY OPERATION PLAN (EOP) OVERVIEW

Member Megan Hall gave committee members an overview of the new emergency operations plan review process. The Division of Emergency Management is authorized by Nevada Revised Statute to review Emergency Operations Plans submitted by public school districts, charter schools and private schools. DEM has a goal of reviewing 20% of yearly submissions. This year (2022) the total number of plans reviewed will be 47 and plans will be selected randomly. A statewide committee has been compiled with membership reflecting what is required for development and school committees, per NRS. The EOP review committee is using Federal guidelines (REMS) and Nevada Revised Statute to follow a standardized review process of each plan based on type of school. This is a two-step process with the paper plan review occurring first followed by an interview with the school's emergency operations plan official. Data from the review process will be used by DEM and NDE to provide training programs, as well as, help to build connections with each school in regards to their EOP. The goal of this process is also to create a Nevada model plan based on the REMS (TA) guide.
