Presentation to the State Board of Education November 12, 2020

Intentions

- 1. The White Pine County School District (WPCSD) desires to invite all students back onto campus for In-Person Learning--85% of students are currently on campus.
- 2. The WPCSD desires to provide convenient and accessible learning activities including Zooming into lessons for students when they need to be absent for caution's sake--on average, 6% of student body district-wide attends virtually each day.
- 3. The WPCSD intends to provide fully online learning through <u>SchoolsPLP</u> for families who are uncomfortable returning to campus--elementary and middle school students thriving while high school students are struggling.

Guiding Principles

- 1. The plan is adaptable.
- 2. There is no way to "guarantee" safety. The practices and procedures in WPCSD's plan are designed to reduce that risk to the extent possible. However, risk will still exist.
- 3. The benefits of students attending a community school with caring, dedicated educators outweigh the risks of virus transmission *as long as* safety protocols are effective in eliminating or minimizing the spread of the virus.
- 4. Individual and family responsibility are not negotiable. WPCSD's plan is the way schools can attempt to meet students' and the community's needs through in-person learning. In other words, and to avoid mincing words, everybody has to do their job.
- 5. As educators, students, parents, and community members, we must exercise *empathy* and treat each other with kindness.

Safety Pillars

- 1. Physical distancing is essential.
- 2. Face coverings, while uncomfortable, are necessary at this point in time.
- 3. Health screenings at home prior to entering buildings are required.
- 4. Individual hygiene is frequent and thorough.
- 5. Environmental disinfection is ongoing.

Logistical Adjustments

- Plexiglass barriers constructed in many classrooms, all front office counters
- Tables traded out for desks
- Sanitization accomplished through classroom "foggers," daily (or more frequently)
 custodial attention
- Variance request to 3 feet from 6 feet for White Pine High School
- Additional lunch periods added at all schools
- 4 teachers reassigned to serve online students
- Devices and connectivity
 - Students grades 5-12 all have their own Chromebook
 - Devices and hotspots have been provided to online families upon request
 - Additional 200 Chromebooks and 20 hotspots on order

Procedures for Transportation

- 1. Students are expected to wear masks while they ride the bus.
- 2. A maximum of one student per seat is allowed.
- 3. Students are assigned seats.
- 4. Drivers use spray solution to sanitize after each route.
- 5. 18% increase in buses and routes necessary--correlating increase in expenditures.
- 6. 38% increase in families transporting their own students, based upon the district's request for volunteers so that space is available for those families who cannot transport their students.
- 7. Still a waiting list of 50+ families who would prefer busing.

Considerations for Learning

- 1. Social-emotional focus (already aligned in District Performance Plan), including two full days of professional development for all staff members prior to school beginning.
- 2. Ongoing assessment and adjustments related to academic learning.
- Instructional endeavors warehoused in Google Classroom to accommodate required self-isolation during illness.
- 4. Synchronous attendance options for students who are out with illness.
- 5. Digital learning training prior to school beginning as well as continued Friday professional development around literacy.

Considerations for Employees

- Courage, creativity, and grit among ambiguity.
- Humility and gratitude for the benefits we enjoy amidst the turmoil.
- Empathy and kindness towards each other, our community, parents, and students.
- Grace towards ourselves.
- Reinforce with our community the essential and life changing nature of public education.

WPCSD Covid-19 Statistics as of October 29

- 327 students tested since September 8.
 - 5 students positive since September 1; 0 active cases.
 - o 113 students with signs or symptoms who did not test and therefore were required to self-isolate for 10 days.
- 50 staff tested since September 8.
 - o 10 staff positive since September 1; 1 active case.
 - All staff showing signs or symptoms are required to test.
- Of those who have tested positive, all to this point have been mild or asymptomatic cases.

Pressing Forward

- Continuing lofty <u>World Class Literacy</u> vision and professional development.
- Launching district-wide mathematics lesson study, peer observation, and alignment project.
- World Class Relationships (restorative practices) framework unveiled in August.
- Staff, students, and parents are all moving forward as best they can.
