Senate Bill 460 (83rd Session) states that each school district and each charter school shall submit an annual report to the Commission that identifies how funding from the Pupil-Centered Funding Plan is being used to improve the academic performance and progress of pupils, and includes, without limitation, all data or metrics collected by the school district or charter school to demonstrate such improvement. from schools/districts on how they are spending their PCFP money to improve student achievement. The Commission will discuss the format and timing of the report to be submitted and review the current report requirements of NRS 387.12468.
