7. Additional Clarification on Enrollment and Weighted Count Recommendation (Information, Discussion, and Possible Action)

Pursuant to NRS 387.12463(1), the Commission shall monitor the implementation of the Pupil-Centered Funding Plan and make any recommendations that would improve the implementation or correct any deficiencies. The Commission's duty is to review the current procedures regarding how and when pupil counts are pulled and utilized in determining functioning allocations. The Commission will continue to review the impacts of the differences of timing and fluctuating counts to ascertain the funding is both steady and equitable for all public schools.

8. At-Risk (Information, Discussion, and Possible Action)

NRS 387.12463 directs the Commission to review and propose any recommended revisions to the method of calculating the percentage of pupils determined to be most in need of additional services and assistance to graduate. The Commission will review prior recommendations made with respect to the methodology of identifying the percentage of pupils determined to qualify for the At-Risk weight.

9. Charter Reserves (Information, Discussion, and Possible Action)

Pursuant to NRS 387.12463(1)(b), the Commission shall monitor the implementation of the Pupil-Centered Funding Plan (PCFP) and make any recommendations to the Joint Interim Standing Committee on Education that the Commission determines would, within the limits of appropriated funding, improve the implementation of the PCFP or correct any deficiencies of the Department or any school district or public school in carrying out the PCFP. The Commission will continue to study the levels of charter school reserves and at what level should the charters reserves revert to the Education Stability Account.

The Commission will review the possible implications of supplanting and consider moving funds into the PCFP to help pay for the charter transportation expenses.
