

Title IV, Part A Program Public Reporting (FY19-20)

Section 1 – Expenditure Data

The Federal Every Student Success Act (ESSA) Section 4106 requires State Education Agencies (SEAs) to publicly report on Local Education Agencies (LEAs) That receive greater than \$30,000 in Title IV, Part A (Title IVA) funding. The United States Department of Education (USED) selected the FY19-20 grant period which encompasses the entire performance period (27 months) so carryover funding is included in the chart below.

The required ESSA Section 4106 compliance report includes both (1) *LEA <u>Expenditure Data</u> and (2) <u>Performance Date</u> (section 2 below) which indicates progress being made by LEA's toward meeting the objectives and outcomes of their SEA approved applications for the use of Title IVA funding.*

Required in the Title IVA program, is that if an LEA receives <u>greater than \$30,000</u> in Title IVA program funds, it must conduct a comprehensive needs assessment (must be updated at least every three years) that incudes, at a minimum, a focus on the three content areas which include:

- Well-rounded Educational Opportunities (ESEA section 4107);
- Safe and Healthy Students (ESEA section 4108); and
- A portion of the funds for activities to support Effective Use of Technology (ESEA section 4109).

Based on the LEAs student achievement priorities and evidence-based activities identified in their assessment, the LEAs must use:

- At least 20 percent of the funds to support well-rounded educational opportunities.
- At least 20 percent of the funds for activities to support safe and healthy students; and
- A portion of funds for activities to support effective use of technology.
