Inflationary Adjustment in the PCFP

- SB 543 (2019 Session), Section 9.6
 - "rate of inflation" means the percentage of increase or decrease in the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers, West Region (All Items), as published by the United States Department of Labor for the immediately preceding calendar year...



Closer look at "preceding calendar year"

- Agency Request Budgets are due in September of even numbered years
 - Budget due in September 2020
 - Preceding calendar year: January 2018 vs January 2019
 - PCFP Model, Tab 1.1A Assumption Control_Admin
 - "Inflation is the difference between the latest available value of the Consumer Price Index for All Consumer (Seasonally Adjusted, US City Average, All Items, Monthly Series) and the value for the same period of the immediately preceding calendar year."
 - NDE used methodology in Assumptions Control Tab
 - June 2019 vs June 2020

 - Based on APA recommended weight of 1.10: weighted funding total \$6,840
 - Current (combined) weight exceeds APA recommendation of 1.10
