# SB 460 establishes annual district accountability through the NDPF



## SB 460 (2025)

Senate Bill 460 charges NDE with developing the Nevada District Performance Framework (NDPF) – an annual rating system for school districts and charter sponsors against statewide performance targets.

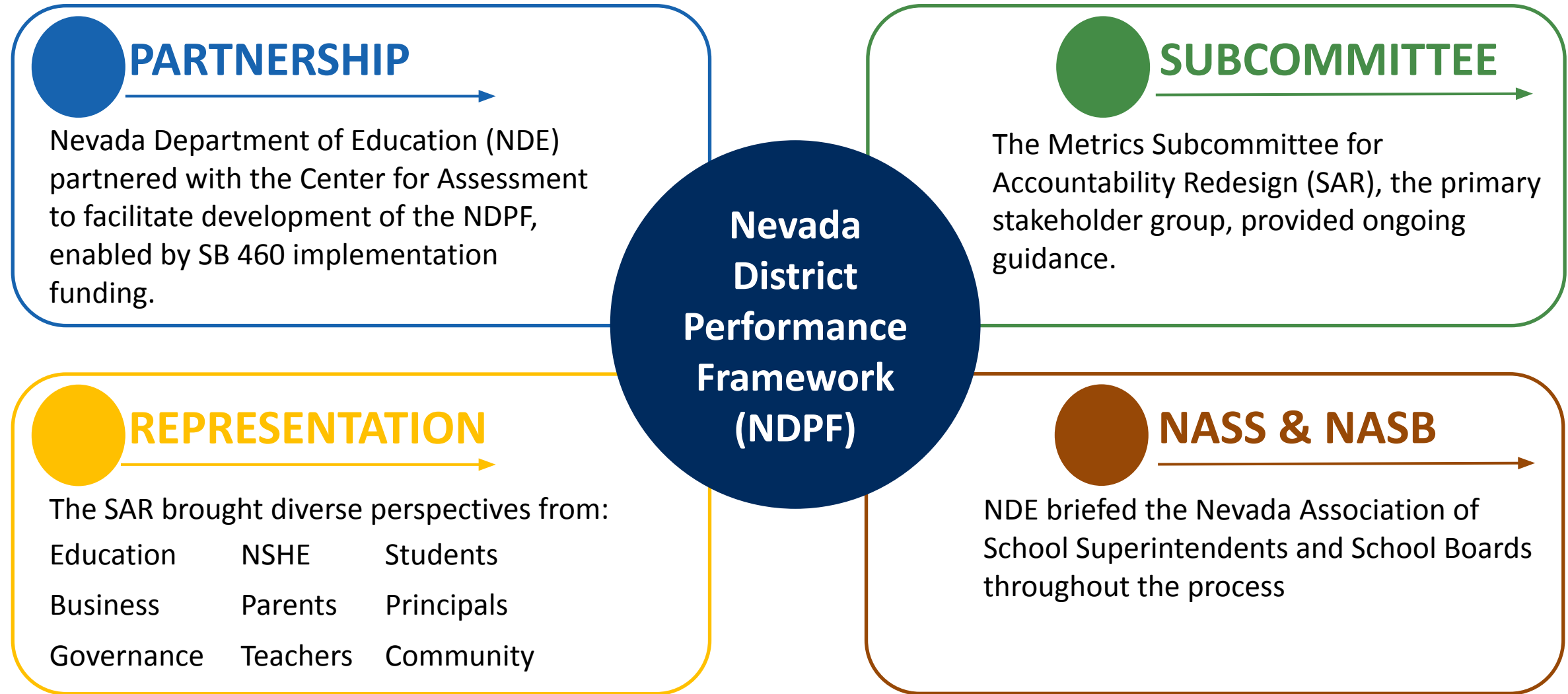
Starting with the 2025-2026 school year, every district and charter sponsor receives an annual NDPF rating.

The NDPF produces district ratings in addition to the existing 1-to-5-star Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) ratings that schools already receive.

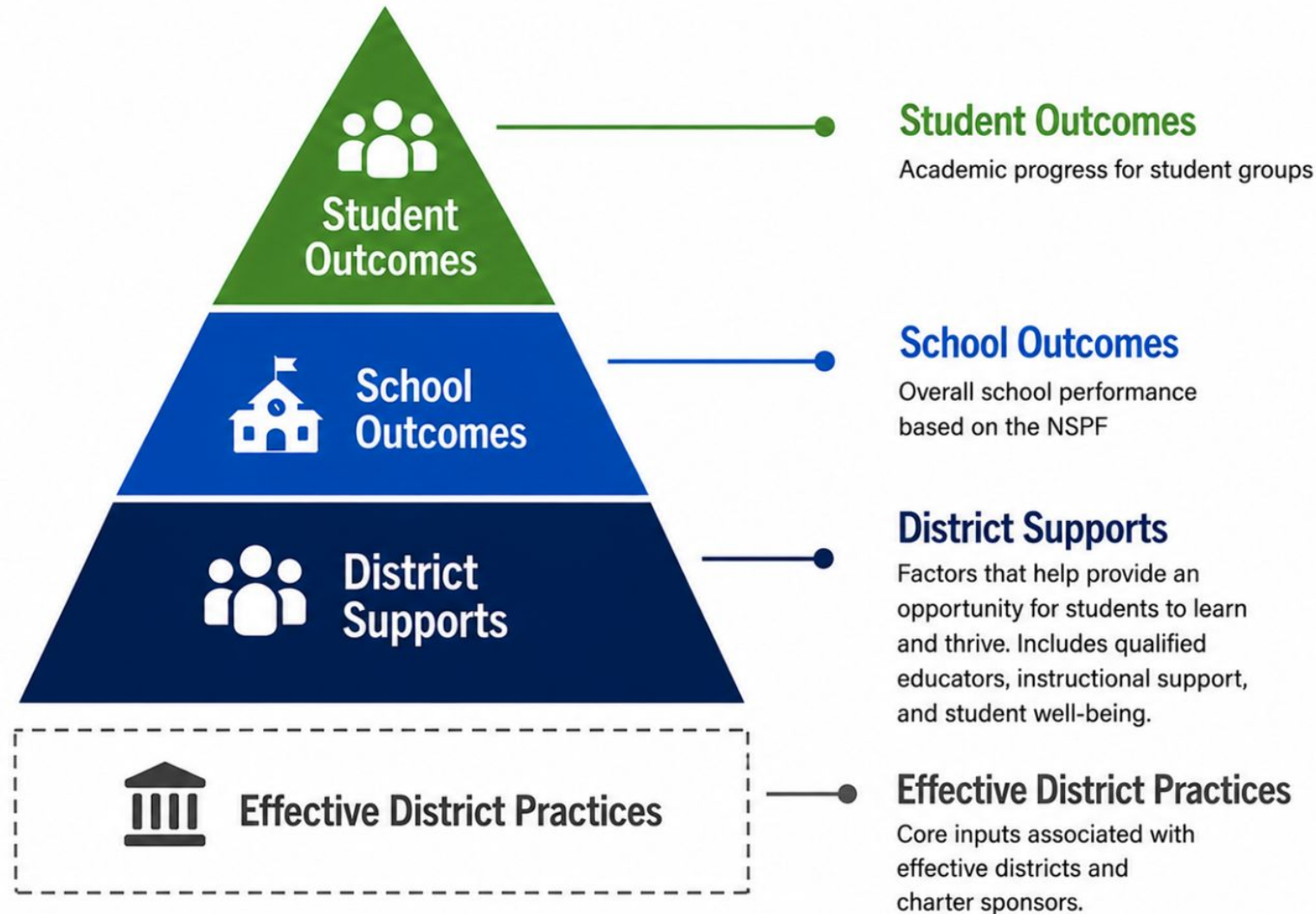
## NDE's Vision for District Accountability:

- 1 **Align and focus** the system around shared goals and what strong districts do
- 2 **Guide action**, not just label performance
- 3 Be **flexible**, built to improve over time
- 4 Be **clear and accessible** to families, trustees, and the public

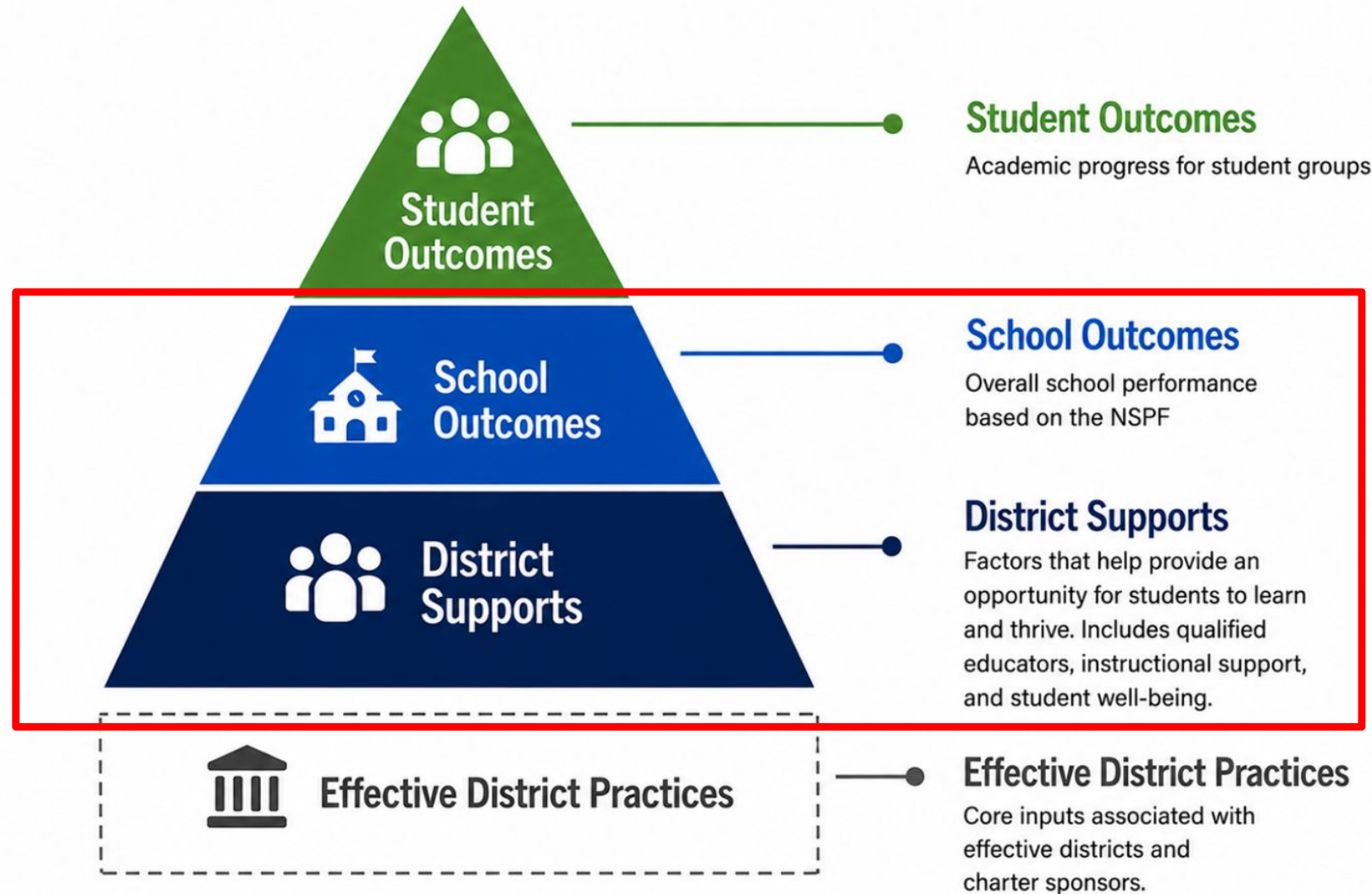
# NDE developed the NDPF with stakeholder and superintendent input; it will continue to evolve over time

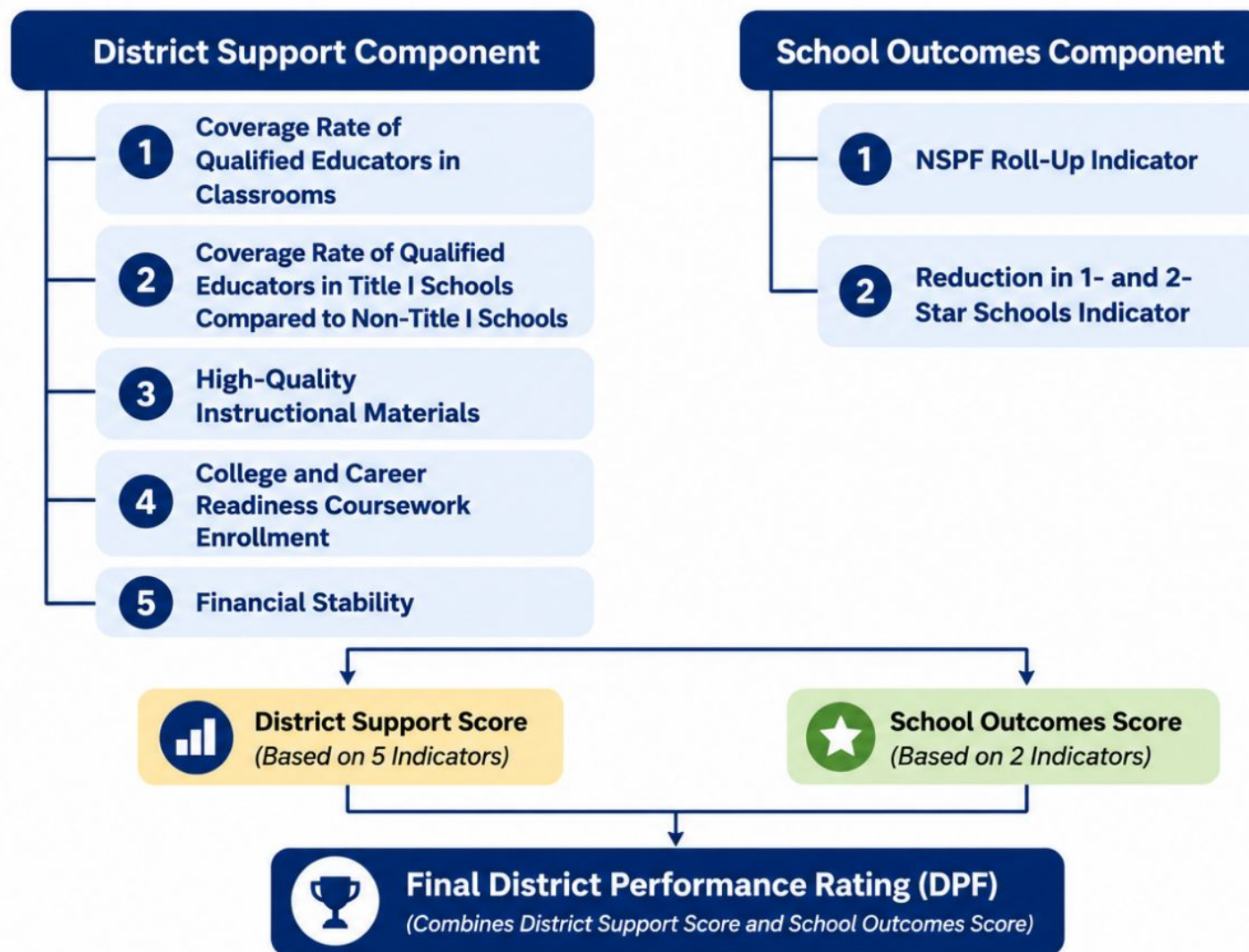

**Note:** Student Outcomes are reported but not scored this year. Effective District Practices do not receive a score.

# District Supports measures five district-controlled indicators that help students learn and thrive



District supports includes five indicators:

**Qualified Educators in Classrooms:** What share of classrooms are taught by licensed educators endorsed to teach the subject?

**Qualified Educators Title I vs. Non-Title I:** Do students in the district's Title I schools have the same access to qualified teachers as students in its non-Title I schools?

**High-Quality Instructional Materials (HQIM):** Do schools in the district use evidence-based reading and mathematics programs and primary instructional materials that meet state-approved criteria?

**College & Career Coursework Enrollment:** Do students take at least one qualifying college or career readiness course?

**Financial Stability:** Did the district maintain an adequate ending fund balance and avoid a sustained decline?

The **District Supports rating** is determined by combining the five indicators and producing a component-level rating.

# School Outcomes uses two measures: NSPF Roll-Up and Reduction in 1- and 2-Star Schools



School Outcomes includes two indicators:

## Indicator 1: NSPF Roll-Up

Applies NSPF school ratings at the district level, calculating one for each school level (Elementary, Middle, High).

## Indicator 2: Reduction in 1- and 2-Star Schools

Measures whether a district reduced its count of 1- and 2-star NSPF schools compared to the prior year.

The **School Outcomes rating** is determined by combining the two indicators and producing a component-level rating.

# The overall NDPF rating combines School Outcomes and District Supports



**District Supports:** Determined using five indicators that measure how districts support schools and provide opportunities for students to learn and thrive.



**School Outcomes:** Determined using NSPF roll-up and the Reduction in 1- and 2-Star Schools.

**Today we launch the preliminary NDPF ratings** for Nevada's statewide accountability system for districts and charter sponsors.

**This year we will:**

- **Review** the first year of implementation using results and stakeholder feedback.
- **Refine the NDPF**, in partnership with SAR, by improving its indicators, business rules, performance standards, and reporting. Add student outcomes. Sunset Acing Accountability once this work is complete.
- **Refine the NSPF**, in partnership with SAR, to strengthen school accountability and improve alignment with the NDPF.

- **August 17, 2026:** Preliminary, embargoed results delivered to districts and sponsors for review
- **August 31, 2026:** NASB overview webinar for school board members
- **September 15, 2026:** Public release of NSPF and NDPF final ratings

## BASELINE SY 25-26, NOT SCORED

### Student Outcomes

Evidence that all student groups are progressing toward academic goals and closing achievement gaps. Does not factor into overall rating for 2025-2026 SY.

#### Indicators:

- Early literacy success
- Middle school math success
- High school graduation rate paired with advanced diploma types rate
- One metric selected by each district

## SCORED

### School Outcomes

Overall school performance based on the NSPF within each district. Factors into overall rating.

#### Indicators:

- **NSPF Roll-Up:** applies NSPF methodology at the district level to produce a star rating per school level.
- **Reduction in 1- and 2-Star Schools:** credits districts that move their lowest-rated schools up year over year.

## SCORED

### District Supports

District-controlled practices and conditions that create the conditions for student success. Factors into overall rating.

#### Indicators:

- Coverage rate of qualified educators in classrooms
- Coverage rate of qualified educators in Title I vs. non-Title I schools
- High-quality instructional materials
- College and career readiness coursework enrollment
- Financial stability

# School Outcomes measures overall school performance based on the NSPF



Applies NSPF school ratings at the district level, calculating one for each school level (Elementary, Middle, High). These are considered “school levels” as there will be one for elementary, middle, and high. Once calculated, the decision rules are as follows:

About This Report

The Nevada District Performance Framework (DPF) provides information on district performance using measures that reflect both district-level supports and school performance. The DPF provides information on district performance using measures that reflect both district-level supports and school performance. The framework is designed to provide a consistent approach for evaluating district performance across Nevada.

The DPF consists of two major set of indicators:

- District Support Indicators:** Five district-level indicators that evaluate district supports and processes.
- School Outcomes Indicator:** A summary of school performance based on the district's rolled-up Nevada School Performance Framework (NSPF) star ratings.

Understanding Your Results

District Support Indicators

Example text: District Support Indicators measure district-level performance across five areas. Each indicator receives a score from 1 to 3. The five indicator scores are combined to create a district support score pattern. The pattern is then evaluated against the established scoring rubric to determine the district's overall District Support Indicator rating. The order of scores within the District Support Indicator pattern corresponds to the order of the indicators as listed in the display table. Reordering them does not impact the scoring calculation.

School Outcomes Indicator

Example text: The school outcomes indicator, based on the NSPF Roll-Up, summarizes school performance by combining the district's elementary, middle, and high school rolled-up star ratings. The ratings are presented together to create a district rating pattern for scoring purposes. For consistency and ease of review, the ratings are displayed from lowest to highest; however, the ordering does not impact the scoring calculation.
