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## Notice of Workshop to Solicit Comments on Proposed Regulation

The Commission on Professional Standards in Education is proposing regulation language pertaining to the Nevada Administrative Code (NAC). ## <u>AB 428 Section 3.5(3) (2023)</u>

- 3. The Commission shall adopt regulations requiring the Superintendent of Public Instruction to issue a provisional license to teach if:
- (a) The Superintendent determines that the applicant is otherwise qualified for the license;
  and
  (b) The applicant;
- (b) The applicant:
  - (1) Graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher but is awaiting conferment of the degree; or
  - (2) Satisfies the requirements for conditional licensure through an alternative route to licensure.

The intent of this regulation is to allow the Superintendent of Public Instruction to issue a provisional license, if otherwise qualified, with a 120-day transcript provision, to an individual who completed their initial educator preparation program and graduated with a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution but is awaiting conferment of the degree. This will comply with Assembly Bill 428 section 3.5(3) (2023).

*NAC 391.XXX – Application of a license: Provision pending conferred degree on official college/university transcript; employment; provision removal; invalidation; reapplication.* 

- 1. The Superintendent of Public Instruction may issue a provisional license with a 120day transcript provision to an individual if the individual:
  - a. Is otherwise qualified for a license;
  - b. Completed their initial educator preparation program, all necessary course work, and if applicable, student teaching for the completion of their program;
  - c. Graduated from their initial educator preparation program with a bachelor's degree or higher from a regionally accredited institution that is able to confer a bachelor's degree or higher;
  - d. Is pending the conferment of the degree on an official transcript;
  - e. Submits satisfactory confirmation of sub paragraphs b-c of this section on a form prescribed by the Department that was completed by the college/university where the individual graduated; and
  - f. Pays the fee for a license in NAC 391.045
- 2. A provisional license with a 120-day transcript provision allows the licensee to accept employment and be employed as an educator in a Nevada school.
- 3. The licensee may remove the transcript provision by submitting, as prescribed by the Department, their official college/university transcript with the conferred bachelor's degree or higher to the Educator Licensure office within 120 days of license issuance.
- 4. The license will become invalid if the licensee does meet the requirements of section 3.
- 5. The educator may reapply for their license:
  - a. After removing the transcript provision; and
  - b. Paying the fee for a license in NAC 391.045.
