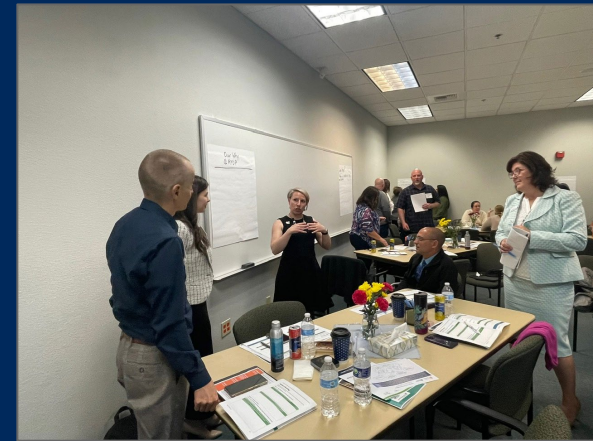

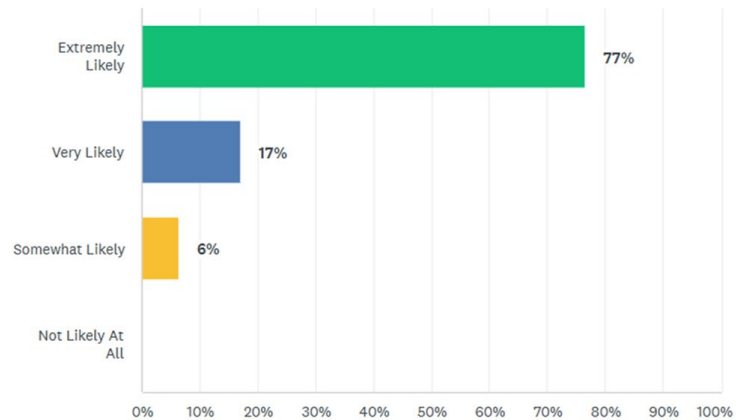

- Emphasized the importance of creating educational environments that prepare students for the future in alignment with the NV Portrait of a Learner

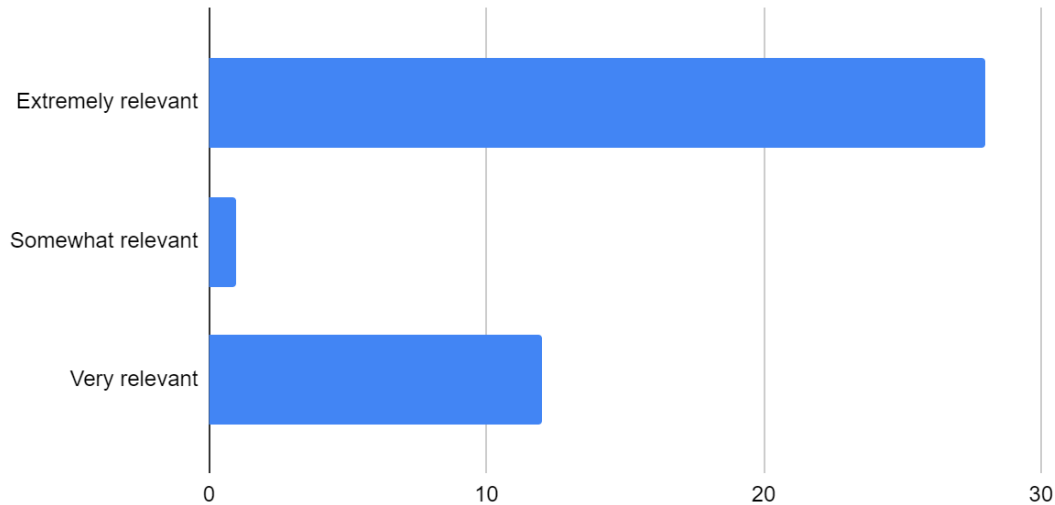

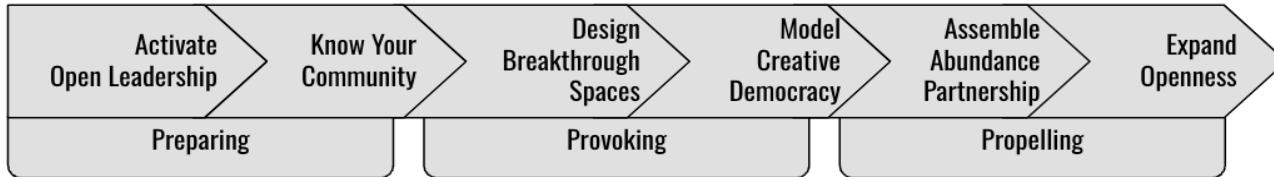

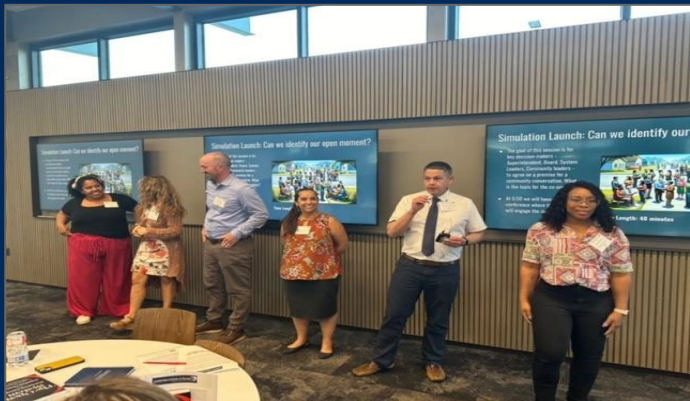
Reimagining Education: A Leadership Simulation Experience with a focus on Chronic Absenteeism

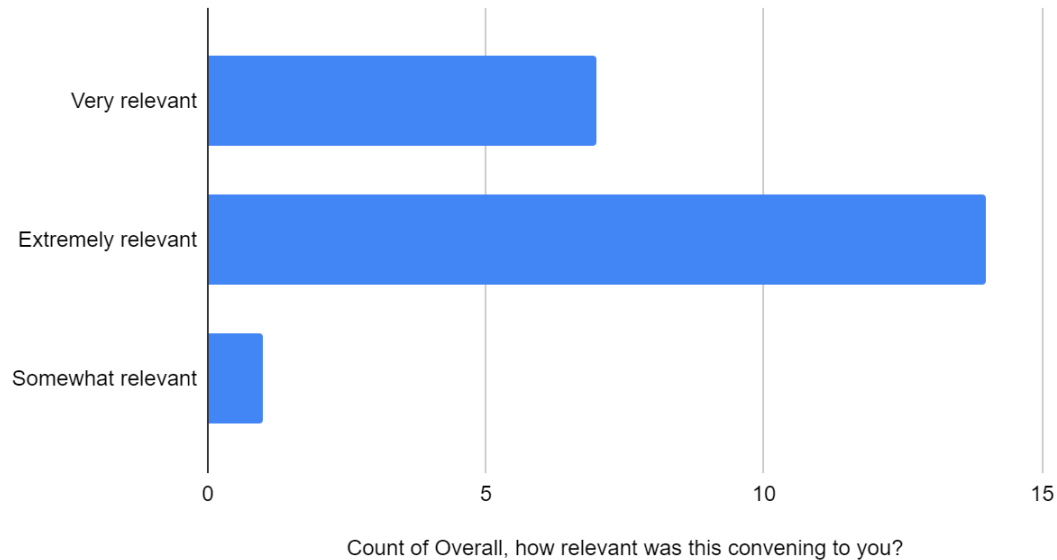
