Organization Overview

The Nevada Association of School Administrators (NASA) is a professional organization that represents school administrators throughout the State of Nevada. Its primary function is to:

- 1. Promote legislation that improves education within the state.
- 2. Provide leadership that facilitates communication among administrators, component groups, and other organizations within the state.
- 3. Provide for professional collaboration by sponsoring and/or facilitating relevant professional conferences, publications, institutes, and workshops.
- 4. Serve as a unifying voice for school administrators in matters affecting education.
- 5. Provide direction and service for its members.
- 6. Promote a positive image of education to the public.

The mission is to provide all educators in Nevada and beyond with high quality, timely, critical, and empowering professional development designed to impact student outcomes, support leadership and instructional improvement, and provide services to support their work.

NASA's Center for Educational Excellence Institute (CEEI) VIII

Approved state funds allowed the Nevada Association of School Administrators (NASA) to offer an institute within the organization dedicated solely to high-quality leadership development. The Center for Educational Excellence Institute (CEEI) VIII represents a focus on excellent professional development for all stakeholders. The attendees of the CEEI VIII sessions included strategists, licensed substitutes, facilitators and teacher-leaders, coordinators, directors, site-level administrators, and central office administrators. Educators from the Clark County School District and Washoe County School District participated in CEEI VIII. CEEI was comprised of presenters who were National experts; Nevada Department of Education experts; NASA board members; state, local and district leaders; and presenters who have relevant work experiences.

The CEEI is modeled after highly effective superintendent/leadership academies throughout the United States. The CEEI teaches the essentials of leadership necessary for optimal success in schools, districts, and organizations alike. Each time NASA offers professional learning sessions under the CEEI umbrella, current relevant and rigorous research-based best practices, and information is provided.

NASA provided CEEI VIII in a virtual format. The virtual format was available for any educator, in any position, especially those aspiring to, or even just thinking about new leadership roles and responsibilities. Any educator, from a first-year teacher to a veteran superintendent, was provided with the opportunity to attend the CEEI VIII.

The theme for the CEEI VIII was "Characteristics and Traits of Exemplary Education Leaders: From Good to Great." The CEEI VIII focused on the essentials of leadership necessary for optimal success in schools, districts, and organizations. Participants received rigorous and current relevant research-based practices. Core competencies were addressed, giving participants the opportunity to reflect, disseminate research-based knowledge related to effective educational leadership behaviors and skills. To support the theme for CEEI VIII, "Characteristics and Traits of Exemplary Education Leaders: From Good to Great," the CEEI Leadership Institute focus addressed key leadership qualities via research from The Center for Creative and Elevated Leadership, as well as the continued focus on Social-emotional Learning Competencies:

- Courage
- Delegation
- Empathy
- Gratitude
- Influence
- Integrity
- Learning Agility
- Respect
- Self-Awareness

CEEI VIII began on Saturday, October 21, 2023, and concluded on Wednesday, February 7, 2024. The calendar was comprised of twenty-four (24) sessions, inclusive of ninety (90) hours of virtual learning and thirteen (13) hours of reflective deliverables. Assignments included collaboration time with session leaders, along with ongoing activities, training, and networking opportunities. All presentations were provided virtually, with sensitivity to accommodations required by participants. NASA utilized closed captions for all CEEI VIII sessions.

The CEEI VIII was comprised of two participant cohorts. One cohort was geared towards teachers and teacher leaders; the other cohort was geared towards school-site and central office administrators. This decision was based on feedback and comments from previous CEEI sessions.

Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Accomplishments: Measurable Objectives

Objective 1

Increase the number of educators trained via the NASA CEEI using the 2022-2023 fiscal year as base line data.

- Baseline Data:
 - **321** educators were trained during the 2022-2023 fiscal year.
 - Anticipated increase for the 2023-2024 fiscal year, an additional 20 educators to receive training.
- 2023-2024 Data:
 - **350** educators participated and completed the CEEI VIII.
 - **310** participants were teachers and other licensed educational personnel.
 - **40** participants were administrators.
 - Resulted in an increase of **29** additional educators' participation.

Objective 2

Provide opportunity for educators to earn **six (6)** credits, **90** license renewal hours.

- NASA CEEI VIII provided the opportunity for educators to earn six (6) credits via the 24 CEEI VIII virtual sessions, for a total of 90 hours; and, to earn 90 license renewal credits via the 24 CEEI VIII virtual sessions.
- To meet Objective 2, NASA CEEI VIII sessions were structured as follows:
 - Six (6) six-hour sessions.
 - **Eighteen (18)** three-hour sessions.

Program Status

- 1. Total Number of CEEI VIII Participants: 350
- 2. Timeline: Saturday, October 21, 2023, through Thursday, February 7, 2024.

3. Total Sessions:

Twenty-four (24) sessions for a total of ninety (90) hours.

- Six (6) six-hour sessions.
- Eighteen (18) three-hour sessions.
- **4. Total Deliverables**: Thirteen (13) hours. Session Leaders utilized 30-60 minutes of collaboration time with their teacher and/or administrative cohort. The collaboration time was delivered in whole group, small group, two-way communication via text messages, Google/Zoom meetings, and email formats.
- 5. Credits: Six (6) credits. Ninety (90) hours of virtual learning with presenters and thirteen (13) hours of deliverables, inclusive of small group.
- 6. Success Measure Outcomes: Participants completed virtual sessions and deliverables in alignment with the Nevada Department of Education guidelines. Participants submitted written group reflections. The reflections allowed participants the opportunity to demonstrate an understanding of characteristics and traits of an exemplary leader that impact change and equitable action to enhance student growth; both academically and socially.
 - EXAMPLE: Participants submitted a 3–5-page reflection to the primary CEEI Session Leader focusing on the following:
 - What are two characteristics of exemplary leaders?
 - How will the two characteristics you addressed assist you as a school or district leader?
 - Why are these characteristics critical for the 21st Century leader?
- **7. Funding:** The **\$50,000** allocated to NASA was used to cover the cost of 23 facilitators of learning/presenters and the 2 session leaders. All funds were utilized and CEEI VIII was completed as planned.
 - Stipends to compensate CEEI speakers for design, preparation and/or delivery. All travel expenses (transportation, lodging, and per diems allowable rates) are included in the stipends, as well as the various time zones.
 - Individuals selected to serve as facilitators of learning/presenters are educational leaders with expertise on the international, national, state, university, and school district level. Several of the individuals are also superintendents serving Pre-K-12 rural, urban, and metropolitan school districts.
 - The selection process is to ensure representation of the various components of diversity, such as, but not limited to race, ethnicity, gender, geographic region, experience, age, etc.

Program Status (continued)

- The selection process is also a reflection of the Nevada Association of School Administrators (NASA's) stance on diversity, equity, and inclusion listed below:
 - NASA's diversity, equity, and inclusion philosophy helps us to reach our full potential. We believe in equity. We act on the diverse needs of our partners, communities, school districts, and the educators we serve by supporting the development of professional learning that is representative of and responsive to the needs of the entire state of Nevada.




