Holocaust Studies Micro-Credential Handbook

Purpose

The Holocaust Studies Micro-Credential certifies that an educator has completed a structured course sequence in Holocaust education and has demonstrated instructional implementation through a final portfolio. Educators completing the full pathway will receive a one-time stipend of \$1,000 based on availability.

Learning Pathway Overview

The pathway is organized into three tiers: Introductory, Intermediate, and Advanced. Educators who complete courses in each tier and finish with a Capstone Portfolio. External courses from approved institutions may count toward completion.

Requirements to earn the Micro-Credential:

- Complete 8 courses in total:
 - Level 1 3 Foundational courses (no less than 35 hours)
 - o Level 2 3 Intermediate courses (no less than 35 hours)
 - Level 3 2 Advanced courses (no less than 20 hours)
- Attend an approved virtual or in-person conference (Echoes and Reflection, SHOAH or Belfer)
- Complete Capstone Course & Portfolio Submission

Level 1: Foundational Knowledge (Choose 3)

- Introduction to the Holocaust
- From Traditions to Tragedies
- Exploring Museums, Monuments, and Memorials
- Memory and Resistance of the Holocaust through the Arts



Level 2: Intermediate Courses (Choose 3)

- Rescuers Kindertransport
- Rescuers Bravery in the Shadows
- Rescuers Diplomacy and Defiance
- Daring to Rescue
- Separating Families Holocaust and Beyond
- Life in the Ghettos
- Teaching the Holocaust through Music and Art 1

Level 3: Advanced Inquiry (Choose 2)

- The Fruits of Survival
- Hitler Had No Original Ideas
- Intergenerational Memory and Justice
- Bystanders and Complicity
- Teaching the Holocaust through Music for Music Teachers
- Teaching the Holocaust through Art for Art Teachers

Alternate Coursework Options

Educators may utilize non NDE courses through pre-approved options from:

- Yad Vashem International School for Holocaust Studies
- USC Shoah Foundation IWitness
- Echoes & Reflections (ADL, USC Shoah, Yad Vashem)
- Nevada Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies (UNLV or UNR)

A certificate or transcript of completion is required.



Capstone Course: Implementation & Reflection (Required)

Course Title: Holocaust Studies: Capstone in Instruction & Impact

Educators must submit a portfolio that includes:

- 1+ lesson plans or unit outlines based on course content
- Student work samples (anonymized)
- A 1–2-page reflection on instructional impact
- Classroom photos (with appropriate release or faces blurred, student displays, or video clips

Awarding the Micro-Credential

Upon successful review of all coursework and a complete capstone submission, educators will be awarded the Holocaust Studies Micro-Credential by the Nevada Department of Education.
