- School and District leaders must have a great understanding about the essentials of leadership that is necessary for optimal success in the teaching and learning environment. The CEEI VIII provided participants the opportunity to review rigorous and current research-based practices related to effective educational leadership behaviors and skills.
- The CEEI leadership institute addressed key leadership qualities referencing research via The Center for Creative and Elevated Leadership: as well as the continued focus on Social- emotional Learning.

Dates: Saturday, October 21, 2023, through February 7, 2024 Participants attended <u>24</u> Sessions and received <u>6</u> Contact Units.

Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Accomplishments: Measurable Objectives

Objective 1

Increase the number of educators trained via the NASA CEEI VIII using the **2022-2023** fiscal year as base line data.

- <u>321</u> educators were trained during the 2022-2023 fiscal year.
- Anticipated increase for the **2023-2024** fiscal year- an additional **<u>20</u> educators** to receive training.

2023-2024 Data:

- There was an increase of <u>29</u> additional educators participating in the NASA CEEI VIII.
- <u>350</u> educators participated and completed the NASA CEEI VIII.
- <u>310</u> participants were teachers and other licensed personnel. (<u>286</u> teachers and other licensed personnel were trained during the 2022-2023 fiscal year.)
- <u>40</u> participants were administrators. (<u>35</u> administrators were trained during the 2022-2023 fiscal year.)



Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Accomplishments: Measurable Objectives

Objective 2


Provide opportunity for educators to receive <u>6</u> credits, <u>90</u> license renewal hours.

- NASA CEEI VIII provided the opportunity for educators to earn <u>6</u> credits via the <u>24</u> CEEI VIII virtual sessions for a total of <u>90</u> hours.
- To meet Objective 2, NASA CEEI VIII sessions were structured as follows:
 <u>6</u> six-hour sessions
 <u>18</u> 3-hour sessions



Evaluation Feedback, 2023-2024 Fiscal Year

- Formative and summative assessments were conducted to ensure the CEEI VIII professional learning sessions and training activities meet the intended learning outcomes.
- Continual surveys, needs assessments, and reviews of compiled data will assist in making decisions regarding modifications to future CEEI professional learning.
- Participants completed survey evaluations for each CEEI VIII session via Google. Survey responses were anonymous.

Program Status, 2023-2024 Fiscal Year:

- Total Number of CEEI VIII Participants: 350
- **Timeline**: Saturday, October 21, 2023, to Thursday, February 7, 2024. (Every session was completed with a **98%** participant attendance rate.)
- Total Sessions: <u>24</u> sessions for a total of **90** hours. <u>6</u> six-hour sessions and <u>18</u> three-hour sessions.
- Total Deliverables: <u>13</u> hours. Session Leaders utilized 30-60 minutes of collaboration time with their teacher and/or administrative cohort. The collaboration time was delivered whole group, small group, and two-way communication via text messages, Google/Zoom meetings, and emails.
- Success measure outcomes: Participants completed virtual sessions and deliverables in alignment with the Nevada Department of Education guidelines. Participants submitted written group reflections. The reflections allowed participants the opportunity to demonstrate an understanding of adaptive and transformational leadership traits, characteristics that impact change, and equitable action to enhance student growth.

EXAMPLE: Participants submitted a **3–5-page reflection** to the primary CEEI Session Leader focusing on the following:

- What are two characteristics of exemplary leaders?
- How will the two characteristics you addressed assist you as a school or district leader?
- Why are these characteristics critical for the 21st Century leader?

1. What are two characteristics of exemplary leaders?

Integrity. Integrity is an essential leadership trait for the individual and the organization. It's especially important for top-level executives who are charting the organization's course and making countless other significant decisions. Our research shows that integrity may actually be a potential blind spot for organizations. Make sure your organization reinforces the importance of honesty and integrity to leaders at various levels.

Respect. Treating people with respect on a daily basis is one of the most important things a leader can do. It will ease tensions and conflict, create trust, and improve effectiveness. Respect is about more than the absence of disrespect, and it can be shown in many different ways, but often starts with being a good listener.

Synthesis:

Leaders with integrity act in accordance with their words (i.e. they practice what they preach) and own up to their mistakes, as opposed to hiding them, blaming their team, or making excuses. Abraham Lincoln is an iconic example of a leader who demonstrated integrity despite the significant challenges he faced during his presidency.

What are two characteristics of exemplary leaders?

One characteristic of an exemplary leader that can assist us as a school leader is integrity. Integrity is behaving in alignment with a set of strong values or principles. Providing reliability, honesty, loyalty, and trustworthiness while at the same time showing transparency, empathy, and inclusiveness allows others to feel safe and ready to be a part of the process.

Another characteristic of an exemplary leader are ones that practice gratitude. This is a significant part of being a great leader because someone who shows appreciation to their colleagues during the process of building a school or continuing to grow a school, just continuing excellence can foster positive growth through gratitude. Leaders need to express gratitude to their staff for being there, for working, and encouraging them to reach beyond their own limits.


People tend to work harder if they know they have someone who appreciates their hard work and what they do. If staff members feel that they are valued, they will

Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Accomplishments: Collaboration

- NASA CEEI VIII participants were provided the opportunity to earn 24 Continuing Education Units (CEUs) via a PILOT Socialemotional Learning (SEL) independent study.
- NASA in partnership with Academic Freedom (AF) provided the opportunity for educators to earn <u>24</u> CEU credits by completing a concurrent online SEL course, aligned to the CEEI VIII content and customized for site-base, personalized, experiential learning by implementing SEL lessons into work settings.
- Educators utilized the option to earn the **additional credits** via Western Nevada College through an independent study format done outside of the NASA CEEI VIII **90-hour** sessions.
- <u>8</u> educators completed the SEL independent study and received <u>24</u> CEU credits and an AF Certificate of Completion worth 3 course credits from Western Nevada College.
- This educational opportunity was not funded via the RPDP Grant.
- Educators were eligible to participate due to the collaboration between NASA and Academic Freedom.

While increasing social emotional learning during NASA CEEI VIII, participants gualify for Academic Freedom's Independent SEAD Study.


Independent studies help participants make meaning of new information by practicing it in their daily life/work, reflecting on goals, and planning implementation strategies.
