Area of Greatest Need: Increasing Staff to Expand Available Support

Primary Challenge: Maintaining personnel levels (i.e., salary and benefits costs, travel, supplies) over time due to inflated costs.

This challenge results in:


- reductions in operating funds,
- not re-hiring vacant positions, and
- reduction in staff and reduced contracts (number of days)

Ultimately, this leads to fewer staff and less time available to support leaders and educators in a time when the needs are greater than ever before.

Staffing & Funding

- Budget (2007-09) \$26,203,096
 - Excludes: Administrative Training (\$200,000) & Statewide Evaluation Funding (\$200,000)
- Budget (2019-21) \$15,007,090 (reduced 2020)
- Budget (2021-23) \$14,479,394
- Budget (2023-25) \$15,134,786
- Training Staff (2023-24)
 - NNRPDP 7 full-time trainers
 - NWRPDP 13 full-time trainers, 2 halftime trainers
 - SNRPDP 18 full-time trainers, 7 contracted trainers (various contracts)
 - Nevada employed 26,908 teachers, 6,774 paraprofessionals, and 1,737 administrators in 2022-231.
