QUESTION 1 - Organization Overview and Target Audience

About the Leadership Institute of Nevada

The Leadership Institute of Nevada (LION) is an independent 501(c)(3) nonprofit established in March 2022, built on twelve years of programming incubated under The Public Education Foundation. LION’s mission is to identify, develop, and retain exceptional educational leaders; bridge public and private sector expertise; and drive lasting, systemic improvement in Nevada’s public schools.

LION connects Nevada administrators to the nation’s foremost thought leaders through high-quality, timely professional development, operating from the conviction that leadership transformation is the most powerful lever for improving student outcomes. LION has grown a statewide alumni network of over 400 Executive Leadership graduates and 400 Teacher Leader Academy graduates, the vast majority of whom remain engaged as principals, assistant principals, district administrators, and teacher leaders.

LION’s organizational capacity is substantial and directly relevant to this grant’s objectives. Project personnel include certified NEPF trainers with direct experience facilitating evaluation calibration sessions, instructional coaches who have delivered NRS 391-aligned administrator development, and program managers with demonstrated logistics expertise for high-volume statewide convenings. LION has successfully executed large-scale professional learning events with 100–400 participants, including multi-day summits requiring complex venue logistics, speaker coordination, and materials production. LION’s established partnerships with all Nevada RPDPs and its NNRPDP co-hosting relationship demonstrate the infrastructure to support evaluation training for teachers, counselors, and OLEP-affiliated administrators statewide. All LION programs are independently evaluated by a third-party evaluator, ensuring data integrity for grant reporting.

Target Audience and Anticipated Participation

This proposal targets Nevada school-based and district-level administrators responsible for evaluating licensed educators under the Nevada Educator Performance Framework (NEPF) and Senate Bill 460 (SB460), as defined under NRS 391.465 and NRS 391.510. The target audience explicitly includes principals and assistant principals who evaluate classroom teachers, school counselors evaluated under the licensed educator framework, and administrators affiliated with the Office of Latino Education Programs (OLEP), spanning the full experience spectrum from new evaluators to veterans.

Nevada’s geography creates persistent professional development inequities. LION will employ a structured statewide recruitment plan: direct outreach to all 17-county school district human resources and professional development offices, partnership coordination with NNRPDP for Northern Nevada participants, and targeted invitations through LION’s alumni network of over 800 graduates. LION anticipates serving up to 300 participants across four convenings, approximately 100 per Summit Workshop and 50 per Alumni Convening. Summit events will be held across Northern Nevada in Reno and Elko to maximize equitable statewide access for rural, urban, and suburban administrators alike.

Organizational Readiness and RPDP Alignment

LION’s programming fully aligns with Nevada’s Standards for Professional Development and the Northeastern Nevada Regional Professional Development Program (NNRPDP). LION is co-hosting a Summit event in Reno and co-hosting with NNRPDP in Elko, making the Nevada Administrator Professional Learning Series an integrated component of Nevada’s coordinated approach to leader development and educator evaluation quality.

QUESTION 2 - Scope of Work and Priority Alignment

Program Overview

LION proposes the Nevada Administrator Professional Learning Series - four convenings anchored by two Education Leadership Summit Workshops for administrators and two Alumni Network Convenings for LION's statewide leadership community. Summit Workshop One is co-hosted in Reno; Summit Workshop Two is co-hosted with NNRPDP in Elko. All content is explicitly aligned to the Teachers and Leaders Council (TLC) recommendations, the NEPF, and SB460 mandates.

Education Leadership Summit Workshops (up to 100 participants each)

Workshop One (Reno) - Effective Communication with Educators and Stakeholders (Admin Stds 1 & 4; Teacher IP Std 4): Anchored by Jennifer Abrams, internationally recognized communications consultant and author of *Having Hard Conversations*, this full-day workshop builds administrators' capacity to communicate a coherent instructional vision and conduct rigorous, legally defensible evaluation conversations. Agenda: Morning Block 1 - NEPF Framework Overview and SB460 Compliance Requirements; Morning Block 2 - Calibration Lab scoring Teacher IP Standard 4 using video exemplars and NEPF rubric anchors, with inter-rater reliability (IRR) scores recorded pre- and post-calibration; Afternoon Block 1 - Hard Conversations Practicum: scripting post-observation feedback aligned to NEPF rubric levels 1-4; Afternoon Block 2 - Site-Based Communication Action Planning. Participants leave with a completed action plan and submit a post-observation feedback sample within 30 days.

Workshop Two (Elko) - Effective Communication with Educators and Stakeholders (Admin Stds 1 & 4; Teacher IP Std 4): Anchored by Jennifer Abrams, internationally recognized communications consultant and author of *Having Hard Conversations*, this full-day workshop builds administrators' capacity to communicate a coherent instructional vision and conduct rigorous, legally defensible evaluation conversations. Agenda: Morning Block 1 - NEPF Framework Overview and SB460 Compliance Requirements; Morning Block 2 - Calibration Lab scoring Teacher IP Standard 4 using video exemplars and NEPF rubric anchors, with inter-rater reliability (IRR) scores recorded pre- and post-calibration; Afternoon Block 1 - Hard Conversations Practicum: scripting post-observation feedback aligned to NEPF rubric levels 1-4; Afternoon Block 2 - Site-Based Communication Action Planning. Participants leave with a completed action plan and submit a post-observation feedback sample within 30 days.

Alumni Network Convenings (up to 50 participants each)

Alumni Convening One (Las Vegas) - Student Engagement in an Age of Smartphones and Devices: Anchored by Dr. Jonathan Haidt (NYU Stern, *The Anxious Generation*, 2024), this convening equips leaders with evidence-based strategies for reclaiming student attention. Participants examine device culture and leave with school-level student engagement action plans.

Alumni Convening Two (Las Vegas) - Gender Gaps in Learning: Facilitated by Dr. Diane Halpern, past APA president and leading researcher on gender and cognitive differences, this convening examines the distinct academic trajectories of boys and girls in Nevada schools. Participants develop site-based equity action plans and a leadership framework for rebalancing opportunities.

Intended Outcomes and Success Measures

- **Evaluator Calibration:** Increased inter-rater reliability on NEPF rubric scoring through calibration labs at both Summit Workshops.
- **TLC Standards Alignment:** Evaluative practices aligned to Administrator Standards 1 & 4 and documentation of Teacher IP Standard 4 evidence.
- **SB460 Compliance:** Demonstrated command of SB460 documentation, observation cycles, and summative scoring.
- **Leader Communication:** Submission of a Leader Communication Plan integrated with the SB460 evaluation calendar.
- **Alumni Outcomes:** School-level action plans for student engagement and gender-equitable programming, reviewed by LION facilitators.

Quantitative targets: (1) 80% of Summit Workshop participants show measurable improvement in inter-rater reliability on NEPF rubric scoring; (2) 85% score at or above "Proficient" on the post-workshop NEPF knowledge assessment; (3) 90% submit completed site-based action plans within 30 days; (4) 80% report increased confidence in SB460-compliant evaluation cycles; and (5) the independent evaluator's final report documents measurable shifts in evaluative practice. Reported in interim (January 2027) and final summative grant reports (June 2027).

QUESTION 3 - Timeline and Method of Delivery

Comprehensive Program Timeline

The Nevada Administrator Professional Learning Series spans the 2026–2027 school year across six phases, each with defined milestones, deliverables, and data collection points.

Delivery Platform and Differentiation of Modalities

In-Person (Primary Modality): All four convenings are delivered in-person in ADA-accessible venues (up to 100 per Summit, 50 per Alumni Convening). Participants engage in live keynotes, optional NEPF calibration labs using video exemplars, small-group coaching, peer networking, and facilitated action planning which is the preferred modality for hands-on NEPF mastery.

Hybrid (Synchronous Remote + In-Person): Administrators in rural counties (e.g., Esmeralda, Eureka, Lander, Mineral, Nye, White Pine) may participate via live-streamed Zoom Webinar with a dedicated remote facilitator. Remote participants access the same pre-assessments, submit action plans through LION’s online portal, and join virtual calibration breakouts, substantively equivalent to in-person participation.

Virtual (Asynchronous On-Demand): LION’s password-protected Virtual Resource Library may provide recorded keynote sessions (released 30 days post-convening), NEPF rubric guides, calibration anchor videos, SB460 documentation templates, and reflection journal prompts. Focus groups may be held virtually.

Assignments, Tasks, and Evidence of Training Effectiveness

Pre-Convening: All Summit Workshop participants complete a 20-item NEPF Knowledge Pre-Assessment and an Evaluator Confidence Self-Survey at least two weeks prior, establishing a measurable baseline for post-survey comparison.

During-Convening: Small-group action planning produces written artifacts (communication, wellness, and equity plans) reviewed by facilitators before participants leave. Calibration labs may be optional and engage participants to independently score NEPF video exemplars before and after facilitated calibration; IRR scores are calculated and recorded.

Post-Convening: Within 30 days of each Summit Workshop, participants may submit one post-observation feedback sample demonstrating transfer of NEPF language to actual evaluation practice. Reflection journals are submitted after each Alumni Convening.

Multi-Layered Evidence Model: (1) Pre/Post Knowledge Assessments document NEPF mastery growth. (2) IRR Data from calibration labs reported as a quantitative outcome. (3) Artifact Review of post-convening feedback samples via rubric aligned to NEPF and SB460. (4) Participant Surveys - pre/post confidence and satisfaction surveys aggregated in interim and final reports. (5) Independent Third-Party Evaluation: focus groups in May and June 2027 produce a summative report submitted to RPDP by June 30, 2027.
