Review of Nevada Legislative Session 2025

Discussion on Vaping in Schools

Member Blackeye had brought in subject matter experts on the topic. Guests speakers from Clark County School District attended and presented their experiences and their initiatives in the district to address vaping in schools. Associate Superintendent McPartlin and Director O'Bannon shared their programs and initiatives as a district. Programs include education and restorative actions when vaping occurs. Assistant Principal Roehm discussed his results and experience with vape detectors in his school. Members were given an opportunity to ask questions.

Members discussed future possible items. Including student panel, visit from doctor from UC Davis, weapon detection, and creating preliminary recommendations in the event of seat restructuring due to legislation.
