2024-2025 Private School Enrollment Report Executive Summary

NRS 394.130 requires private schools to furnish enrollment data to the Nevada Department of Education. NAC 394.0125 mandates the Department to publish on its website an Annual Directory of Private Schools which includes enrollment data, along with the address and contact information of the school. NAC 394.050 requires non-exempt private schools to also report how their teachers qualify to teach. This report aggregates the data collected in that annual report.

The first data collected is total student enrollment by gender and grade level. In the current 2024-2025 school year, total enrollment in private schools was 22,442 as of October 15, 2024, which reflects a 368-student drop, or 1.61 percent decrease in enrollment, over the school year 2023-2024. It is the first time in four years that private school enrollment has declined.

The most significant decline in enrollment occurred in Washoe County, where student enrollment decreased by 339, representing a 10.7 percent reduction. Clark County experienced a more modest decline of 76 students, equating to a decrease of 0.42 percent. Other counties that saw enrollment reductions include Elko and Lyon, each of which hosts only one private school. In contrast, the remaining four school districts with private schools—Carson City, Churchill, Douglas, and Nye—reported enrollment increases. Notably, Churchill County's private schools saw a substantial gain of 65 students, reflecting an 84 percent increase. The majority of this growth can be attributed to the opening of a third private school in the second semester of the previous academic year.

The largest decrease in enrollment in a single grade level was seen in Grade 10, which fell by 117 students, or 7.4 percent. That was followed by Grade 11 that saw a drop of 97 students, or 6.2 percent, and Grade 1, which had a decrease in enrollment of 90, or 4.3 percent. Although most grade levels saw a decrease in enrollment, there were four grades levels that saw an increase in private school enrollment this school year. Enrollment in Grade 4 was up by 71 students, followed by an increase of 67 students in Grade 8, an increase of 4.2 percent in both grade levels. Grade 7 and Grade 9 also saw increases of 38 and 22 students respectively.

The net number of schools fell by three, dropping from 134 private schools in the state to 131 with three schools closing their doors at the close of the 2023-2024 school year.

This report also supplies a second set of data: the qualifications of each teacher employed by the school. Per NAC 394.050, each teacher employed by a private school must have one of three qualifications:

- (a) Hold a teacher's license issued by the Department or by another state or territory of the United States that is appropriate for the instructor's assignment.
- (b) Hold a bachelor's degree from an institution accredited by a regional accrediting association that is approved by the United States Department of Education and have 3 years of verified full-time or supervised experience in teaching the appropriate grade level; or
- (c) Hold a master's degree in an area that is appropriate for the instructor's assignment from an institution accredited by a regional accrediting association that is approved by the United States Department of Education and have 1 year of verified full-time or supervised experience in teaching the appropriate grade level.

The total number of teachers employed by private schools by county and the qualifications of those teachers are included in this report. Despite the decrease in student enrollment, there were 50 additional teachers reported in the 2024-2025 school year. The number of teachers in exempt schools rose by 106, while the number of non-exempt teachers fell by 56 teachers.


