1. Complete the general requirements for all educator licenses: [General License Requirements](#)
2. Hold a graduate degree in the field of school psychology, from an accredited college or university, to include sixty (60) graduate credits from the required areas below, and other approved optional areas (See [NAC 391.317](#)):
 - A. In the area of psychology and education of the normal child:
 1. Child development
 2. Child and adolescent psychology; and
 3. Theories of learning
 - B. In the area of psychology and education of the child with disabilities:
 1. Abnormal psychology or
 2. The emotionally disturbed or behaviorally disordered child
 - C. In the area of psycho-educational assessment:
 1. Assessment of individual intelligence
 2. Testing of individual personality or projective assessment, with practicum
 3. Diagnosis and treatment of reading disabilities, with practicum
 4. Standardized appraisal
 - D. In the area of techniques of intervention:
 1. A practicum on individual counseling
 2. The process of counseling
 - E. In the area of experimental design
 1. Statistics
 2. Methodology for research
 - F. Complete an internship consisting of two full-time regular semesters or one thousand (1000) hours in school psychology (refer to [NAC 391.318](#) and [NAC 391.319](#) for specific guidelines and options)
3. Individuals applying for an endorsement as a school psychologist are exempt from the Praxis Core Academic Skills exam requirements (unless they are endorsed in another area which requires the exams)
